Resolution Gets Mixed Reaction From Councils

Three local councils have been asked by Oakville Council to support a resolution which would make parents of minors liable for damage to public buildings caused by vandalism.

Markham Township Council passed a resolution Monday supporting the proposal although some members expressed hope that a limit would be put on the parent's liability.

Such a provision is necessary, asserted Councillor Charles Hooper. He noted that vandals were apparently removing the roofing from the new Unionville Community Centre.

Richmond Hill passed the letter informing council of the resolution on to the police committee for its recommendation. Vaughan Township Council accepted a report from the finance and general purpose committee voting agreement with the general intent of the resolution.

However, the committee recommended that council not support the resolution in its present form.

Local Delegates At Tory Meeting

Four district people attended the Progressive Conservative Association Central District Annual Meeting and Workshop in Bradford Saturday.

They were Mrs. G. Commission, Mrs. Connie Matthews, Mrs. Arnold Price and Mrs. A. Howl. Delegates attended from as far north as Georgian Bay and as far south as Toronto.

Guest speakers included Ontario Premier John Robarts, Federal Minister of Labor Michael Starr, and Dr. Matthew B. Dymond, provincial minister of health.

Premier Robarts was greeted by hundreds of waving school children when he entered Bradford Saturday morning. His speech was delivered from the wrestling ring of the community centre.

Ask Engineers To Confer With DOH Officials

Duncan Hopper and Associates, Vaughan Township's engineers, have been asked to discuss some of the ramifications for the township of the province's proposed widening of Highway 7 between Bathurst Street and Highway 400 with Department of Highways officials.

Three streets could be affected by department plans, council was told by its road committee Monday night. Plans for the Dufferin Street intersection will affect the township's future plans for Dufferin Street north of Highway 7.

Problems exist at Keele Street and Jane Street as well, the committee said.

Waterworks committee reported to council that plans for Highway 7 present no major problems for that department.

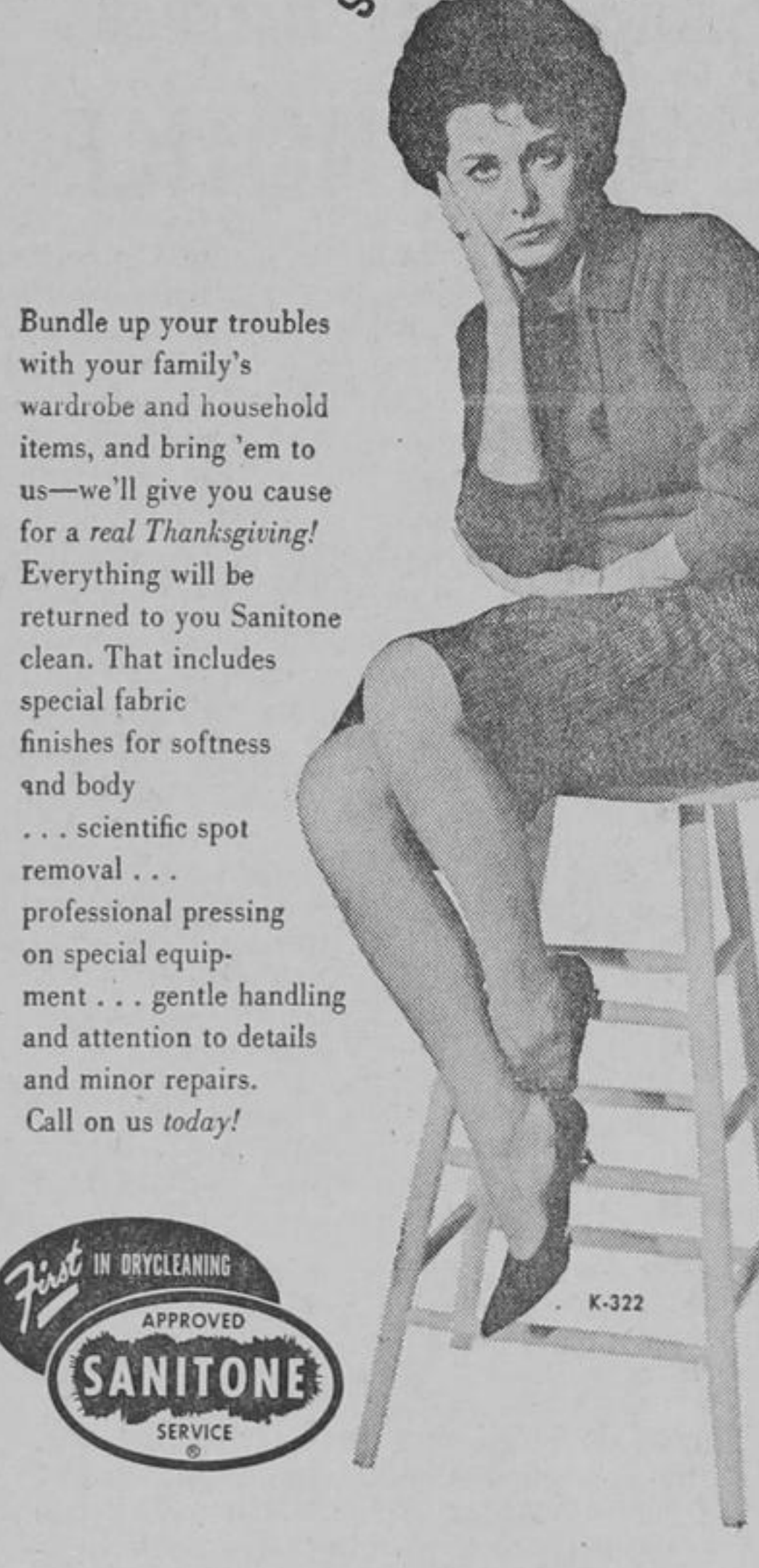
