Conservation Parks In Their Fall Glory Now

This coming weekend is expected to show Nature's fall colors at their best, and the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority suggests the following conservation areas where fall colors will be most prominently displayed:

Boyd area, two miles north of Woodbridge; Claremont near Pickering, 1 1/2 miles north of No. 7 Highway on No. 10 side-road; Heart Lake just east of Brampton; Glen Haffy in Albion Township one mile south of Mono Mills and No. 9 Highway, and Albion Hills, five miles north of Bolton.

The authority has selected the Glen Haffy area for two nature trails hikes at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. October 7. The lookout point of the area commands a panoramic view of the surrounding countryside and should afford visitors an excellent vista of fall colors. Guides on the hike will provide a commentary including an explanation of how tree colors change with the seasons.
