## Cannot Break Contract Official Tells Teachers

Over 100 teachers from Vaughan Township heard an address on ethics of the teaching profession given by Miss Marjorie H. Harrow, executive assistant of the Federation of Women Teachers' Associations of Ontario, September 24 at George Bailey Public School. A "Code of Ethics" for teachers was prepared in 1944-45 and has since become part of the regulations under the Teaching Profession Act. Miss Harrow spoke of the various applications of the code. She noted that teachers should realize that a school area's board of trustees may move a teacher within a school or within an area. She emphasized the part of the Teaching Profession Act which states that a teacher may not break a contract with a school board.

A teacher would break his or her contract by leaving anytime except December or June without the board's consent or by being absent without leave for even one school day, she told the meeting. Miss Harrow pointed out that an oral agreement is just as valid as a written contract in the teaching profession. In seeking a job, teachers are obligated not to accept a job with boards whose relationships with the federation are not satisfactory, Miss Harrow stressed. Teachers are expected to negotiate salary as a group rather than independently, she said. They are not permitted to underbid when applying for a position. Miss Harrow concluded her talk with a discussion of marriage and maternity as it affects young women teachers. Adequate maternity leave of absence may be given, she explained, but teachers are not expected to ask for a leave of absence for marriage.

George Cusdin of King City has been named probationary secretary-treasurer of the village's hydro system. Mr. Cusdin, who is a Baptist lay minister, replaces Miss Carol Brown, who was appointed to the position when the village assumed the system July 1. His post will be part-time only as he will continue his duties as pastor at Bethel Baptist Church in King City, and in Pottageville and Kettleby. He assumed his new duties October 1.

(Continued From Page 1) taking place. "It is further advanced in slum clearance and new housing than any other city in Europe," the Reeve found. Giant strides forward have been made in housing standards over the past 15 years with open, park-like housing developments springing up, he found. Mr. Perkins felt the three-week tour was beneficial and said he picked up several ideas that Richmond Hill could use in its planning and administration. He said the exchange of ideas between countries is advantageous and the knowledge acquired by officials on the trip would prove, he felt, most useful.

## Another point that favorably impressed the Reeve was the diverting of traffic around the cities. He was told by Dutch officials that they have stressed this phase in all planning since the war.

Mr. Perkins was told that a severe shortage of labor exists and unemployment is unheard of in Holland. "The whole economy is geared to the socialist system and from all indications seems to be working out well. The people are looked after from the cradle to the grave." Of all the cities visited Mr. Perkins was "very impressed" with the cleanliness of Copenhagen, Denmark, and the massive housing developments now
