

IN THE MATTER OF Sections 63 and 64 of The Ontario Municipal Board Act, (R.S.O. 1960, c. 274),

- and -

IN THE MATTER OF an application by the Corporation of the Township of Vaughan for an order:

- (a) approving the construction of waterworks at an estimated cost of \$199,795.
- (b) approving the issue by the applicant of debentures in the sum of \$199,-795, repayable over a period of twenty years for such purpose, and
- (c) declaring and directing that the assent of the electors of the Township of Vaughan or those qualified to vote on money by-laws shall not be requisite to be obtained to the passing of by-laws for the purposes aforesaid




