Show Opposition To Water Area -

(Continued From Page 1) three most important problems that would have to be faced. The first of these would be teachers. The program's success depends on a good staff, he pointed out, and not only were they apt to have more difficulty getting good staff, but they might have difficulty retaining them. Another problem to be considered, he stated, was how to get the necessary time for the French lessons out of the time table without having other subjects suffer. The third problem was the administrative one of fitting the students into high school in such a way that the training they had had in elementary school was not lost. This would not be made more difficult because the high schools now have seven different streams which would make it more difficult to keep the students who had had French together. Some older schools in Etobicoke had found it impossible in certain instances to offer a French program tied in with the oral French, Mr. Chapman stated. Other schools had managed it but had had to create at least one extra class, which makes for an added expense at the high school level. Mr. Chapman warned about the danger of embarking on a new venture just because it was fashionable. He pointed out that the high school French course was largely concerned with grammar and French literature and that about 15% of the Grade 13 French examination was on oral work.

Mr. Chapman favoured the gradual approach the board had suggested as he felt that by going into the project before they were ready would easily discredit it altogether. Ratepayers Comment

The audience was then asked to comment on the board's proposal and Mr. Chapman's remarks. Mr. Pat Trant, of Thornhill, speaking from his experience as an elementary school teacher, stated that time could be found in the school curriculum for anything worthwhile and that there was always much wasted time. He pointed out too that the Vaughan Township schools had no gymnasiums and only had regular gym classes in the summer months when they could be taken outdoors, while in all Toronto schools, every class had two gym periods per week. Another member of the audience applauded the board's decision to start the classes at the Grade 5 level — "I would prefer starting it at Grade 1 but will settle for Grade 5" — as she stated that after the age of 10 the child's muscular control is too fixed and rigid. Inspector Gibson pointed out also that Grade 7 and 8 pupils were usually too self-conscious to try and utter the strange sounds required, but youngsters at the Grade 5 level had no such qualms. Chairman Kaiser then polled the members of the board as to their opinions on the matter. Trustee Terry Goodwin expressed himself in favour of the project "provided the ratepayers will stand behind this and will come out and do what is necessary, that is, get out and vote". He stressed also that the ratepayers should be willing to accept an increase of two mills on their taxes "next year because of it" and "your taxes will go up at least 5 mills this year anyway". Trustees Mona Robertson, Dorothy Robertson and Wm. Kerr all favoured the project but stressed that it would require close co-operation with the high schools and that it should not be gone into too quickly. When questioned as to whether this board could commit next year's board to the plan, Chair-
