

Elect Rev. Dil. Evans President District Ministerial Association

The Thornhill - Richmond Hill Ministerial Association met in Thornhill Presbyterian Church for their luncheon meeting at noon on October 26, with past-president James O'Neil presiding. The nomination committee submitted a slate of officers for the next year, and the Rev. Dil Evans of Thornhill Presbyterian Church was elected as president. The Rev. Jack Ward of St. John's Baptist congregation in Richmond Hill continues as secretary, and the Rev. William Paterson of St. Matthew's United Church will again serve as press reporter.

Matters before the meeting for consideration included the recognition of the Bible Society appeal for funds, with an \$800 objective for Richmond Hill, and a comparable objective for Thornhill. It was noted that the secretary of the Society will speak twice in the churches of Richmond Hill on Bible Sunday, December 9, in St. Matthew's and St. Mary's. Arrangements were made for the Rev. A. E. Myers to take the next assignment on the Sunday evening broadcast from CFGM, beginning on November 18, on completion of the present series of broadcasts by the Rev. E. H. Mitchell. The Heritage Series of Telecasts, heard on CBLT on Sundays at 1 o'clock was highly recommended, and the appreciation of the Ministerial to the Canadian Broadcasting Commission expressed.

Initial discussions were held on the form of marking the week of prayer in January this year. The exact plans were left to be decided at the next meeting. This meeting will be held in St. Mary's Anglican Church on the fourth Friday in November.

Asks For Study Of Public School Pupil Increase

Possibility of the inception of either a junior high school or a senior public school for Markham Township School Area Three was discussed at last week's board meeting.

A letter from Maynard Hallman, inspector of schools in the area, sparked a discussion of the need for expansion of school facilities in TSA Three. A pre-school survey submitted to the board indicates a natural growth of one third of a class room per year for the next three years.

It was pointed out that if it were a junior high school it would pass out of public school board jurisdiction.

Mr. Hallman's letter called for the problems arising from increasing school population to be studied as soon as possible.

In other business, the board moved to notify parents that additional insurance coverage will be available to children on school property from a private insurance company, for a small premium payment. Insurance coverage for each child is presently carried by the board.

The board granted permission for the Lions Club to inaugurate an area field day. The club also revealed plans to supply prizes for public speaking competitions and for academic achievement.

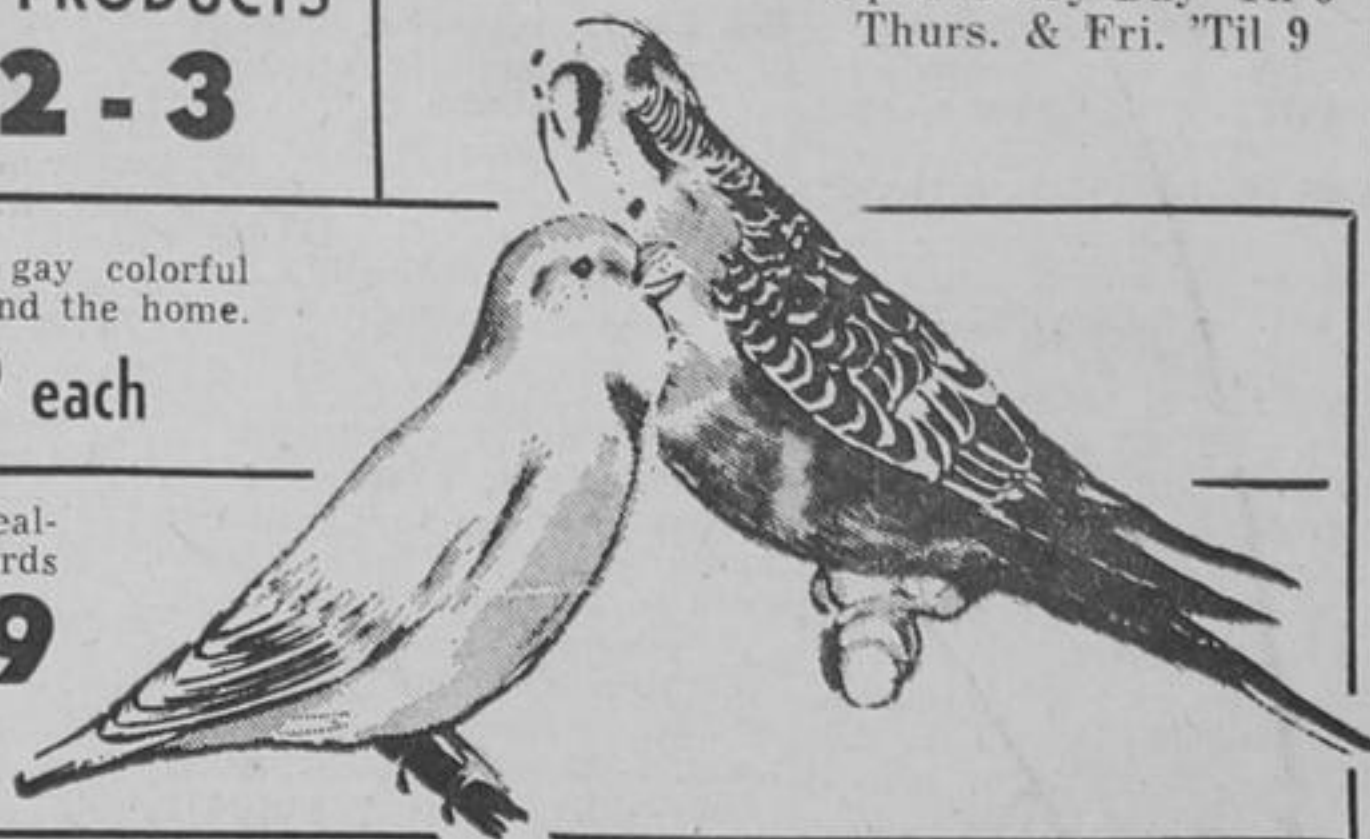
