No Fire Protection

Mud Clogs Area Streets, Township Will Protest

Residents of Highland Park Subdivision, south of Thornhill, have been without fire and ambulance protection since last week during the installation of storm and sanitary sewers in the area, a delegation of residents told Markham Township Council.

The sewer installations are being made by George Wimpey and Co., Toronto contractors, for the Ontario Water Resources Commission. Streets in the subdivision have been made impassable by the rains and snows of last week.

Following council's regular meeting, members toured the area. Reeve Wilfred Dean announced that council will protest to OWRC about closing of the streets.

Church Worker Speaks At Rally

Miss Margaret Halliday, missionary from Angola, was featured speaker at the fall rally of York Presbyterian United Church Women, held in Aurora United Church, October 30.

Miss Halliday has been an educational worker in Angola since 1928. She told of her experiences running a training school there.

First vice-president Mrs. Sylvester Jones of Uxbridge presided for the afternoon session.

Mrs. A. J. Gardhouse of Unionville reviewed several books as well as up to date films on the study of East Asia.

Mrs. A. S. Elson of Richmond Hill stated the allocation for 1963 was 20 per cent larger than 1962.

Residents attending council were William Connors, 51 Highland Park Ave., Douglas Dobson, 55 Highland Park Ave., and Robert Priestman, 48 Highland Park Ave.

They told council many persons, especially the aged, were unable to leave their homes because of the mud. Part of the street has been torn up for more than three weeks, they reported.

Many residents have had to carry groceries and all household supplies for several hundred feet, they claimed.

Deliverymen and repairmen have been unable to get down the street. Postmen have refused to make deliveries to some parts of the streets some days, residents report.

One resident said the postman often appeared at the door covered with mud to his waist.

Water and gas mains have been broken several times by equipment. A cement truck used by the construction company has become mired in the mud several times.

On Monday afternoon, a company bulldozer was needed to pull the truck down the street.

The delegation said the Richmond Hill Fire Department, which provides fire protection in the area, had been warned to park equipment a block away from any torn-up street, and fight the fire from there.

Mr. Dobson said he had rescued an 11-year-old girl from clay into which she had sunk above her rubber boots. "She had become hysterical and kept saying, 'I'm going to sink right down,'" he said.

"A younger child might also become frightened and fall face forward into the mud," Mr. Dobson warned.

Township Engineer Dusan Micklas said the contractor had gambled on good weather to finish the job early, but last week's rain and snow had slowed work.

Spokesmen for the contractor said streets which are now torn up should be passable within 10 days.

Reeve Dean claimed that council had been assured people will get all municipal services. "They could have

done better than this. It's a mess," he stated.

"We've never pulled any punches. I've said all along that we would make them maintain minimum standards," he said.

A representative of the construction firm explained that the job had taken longer than had been expected. Water mains had to be relaid at one end of the street, because they had been improperly installed, he said.

The ambulance, driven by Douglas Ogden, was on its way to an accident at Kennedy Road and 19th Avenue when it was struck by a car turning left into a service station at Kennedy Road and Highway 7, police say.

Damage was minor. The car was driven by R. D. McFayden of Unionville.

Four people were injured in the accident the ambulance was heading for, according to police.

Police report a car driven by C. E. Teckhoven, R.R. 3, Newmarket, northbound on Kennedy, tried to pass a second northbound car. Teckhoven was unable to return to his own lane before meeting and colliding with a southbound car driven by Robert Thoms of 1735 Victoria Park Cr., Scarborough, according to police.

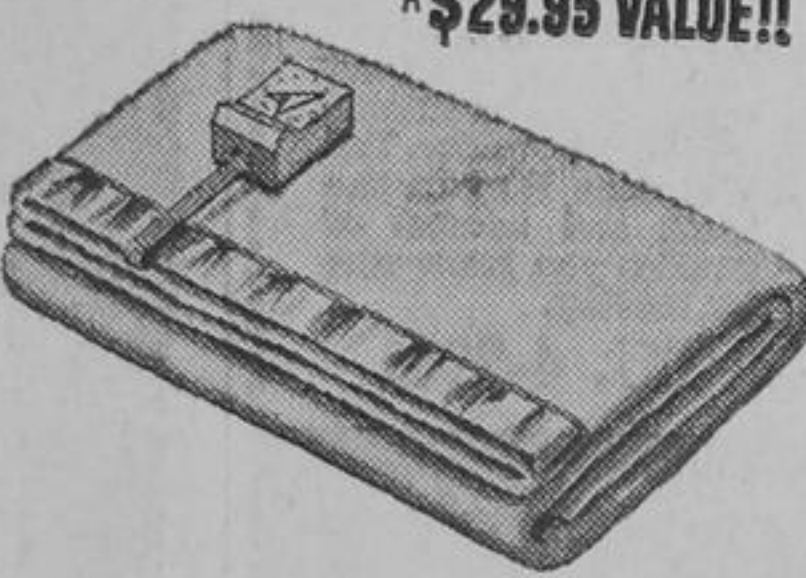
