

York Doctors Pledge \$90,000 Hospitals

The 55 doctors on the active staff of York County Hospital have already pledged \$90,000 to the current campaign fund for the hospital addition at Newmarket and the new hospital at Richmond Hill, Dr. Crawford Rose, Aurora, and chief of the medical staff at York County Hospital, said today.

"I am quite gratified at the response," Dr. Rose said, "and the doctors have accepted their goals." "Total expected from the doctors is \$120,000," Dr. Rose said. Donations run from \$1,000 to \$3,000 each spread over a five-year period. Douglas Storms, Richmond

Hill, vice-chairman of the campaign, reports average donations of \$2,156 from the trustees of York Central Hospital. Stewart Willmot, New-

market, employees canvass chairman, reports that 14 of the county's larger firms have agreed to a payroll deduction plan. Meanwhile, 800 women

have been recruiting the 3,000 canvassers who will be making the calls throughout the county within the next few weeks.

The women are associated with the hospital auxiliaries, headed by Mrs. A. W. McLennan, King Township, and Mrs. R. J. Miller, Richvale. "The success or failure of the campaign rests on this effort," commented Ray Marshall, general chairman.

As the women turn in the names of their canvassers, a canvasser training committee then goes to work. Headed by James Couse, Stouffville, it has the assistance of the life underwriters in the county.

The underwriters, plus additional volunteers, are the "trainers" and with the help of flip charts, volunteer canvassers kits, and literature, there will soon be qualified canvassers at everyone

of the 28,000 front doors in York county.

This year is ready to go into action with the sub-committees throughout the county.

The general canvass itself is headed by a committee chairman Ian Baxter, King, with the help of Jack Dunklee, Richmond Hill. It is broken into regional committees and local chairmen as follows: Sutton, John Sibald; Keswick, Dalton Mercer; Mount Albert, Jack Rye; Bradford, Tom Evans; Newmarket, Gordon Manning; Aurora, Tom Mulock; Oak Ridges, Norm Taylor; Schomberg, Ken Maynard; King City, Robert Silcox; Nobleton, Lorne Goodfellow; Woodbridge, Carl Haas; Maple, L. A. Wells; Kleinburg, D. G. West; Richmond Hill, Robert Little; Thornhill, Jack Barraclough. Some sections are being

set up this week. Among the area chairmen are: S. Lundy for Newmarket and Bradford; J. McLeod for Aurora and Oak Ridges; G. Somers and Eric White for King Township and Woodbridge. Maple and Kleinburg; and George Fish for Gormley, Markham, Stouffville and Unionville.

The drive, for over \$1 million, will provide a total of 389 beds in York county. Today, the county has only 113 beds for a population of 115,000, or less than 1 per 1,000 compared with an Ontario provincial average of 5 beds per 1,000.

Threatens Court Action Unless Request Granted

Developer George Selkirk threw another curve to two members of Markham Township Council Monday night, as he threatened to take the township back to court if they block subdivision of his property in the Langstaff area any further. "I'm tired of receiving prejudiced treatment from the township," he said.

Mr. Selkirk appeared before council to ask for a reply to his request to install water mains for a proposed subdivision between the CNR tracks and Bayview Avenue, south of the Holy Cross Cemetery.

Installation of water mains was not included in an agreement between the township and the builder upheld by a Supreme Court decision in 1954.

Any further hindrance by the township would be considered contempt of court, Mr. Selkirk

charged. Only Reeve Wilfred Dean and Councillor Charles Hoover remained after council's regular agenda to hear Mr. Selkirk's submission. A quorum of three on the five-man council is necessary to enact any legislation.

Mr. Selkirk warned the two councillors he would go back to the court if a reply to his request is not received.

He explained that he does not have to install any water mains according to the agreement. Improvement of roads in the subdivision has been held up until a reply is received, he claimed.

The road would be improved to meet minimum standards outlined in the original agreement. Township officials claim the standards set out in the agreement are below present Ontario Department of Highways standards for subsidy purposes.

Mr. Selkirk said he would be happy to go ahead building the roads and let the township rip them up again to install mains later, if that's what council wants.

In any future court cases, Mr. Selkirk warned that he would seek damages. "The ratepayers of this township can't afford any more suits," he charged.

Mr. Selkirk claimed he had sought no damages in previous litigation, going back to 1952. He said he had suffered a loss of \$250,000 as a result of delays.

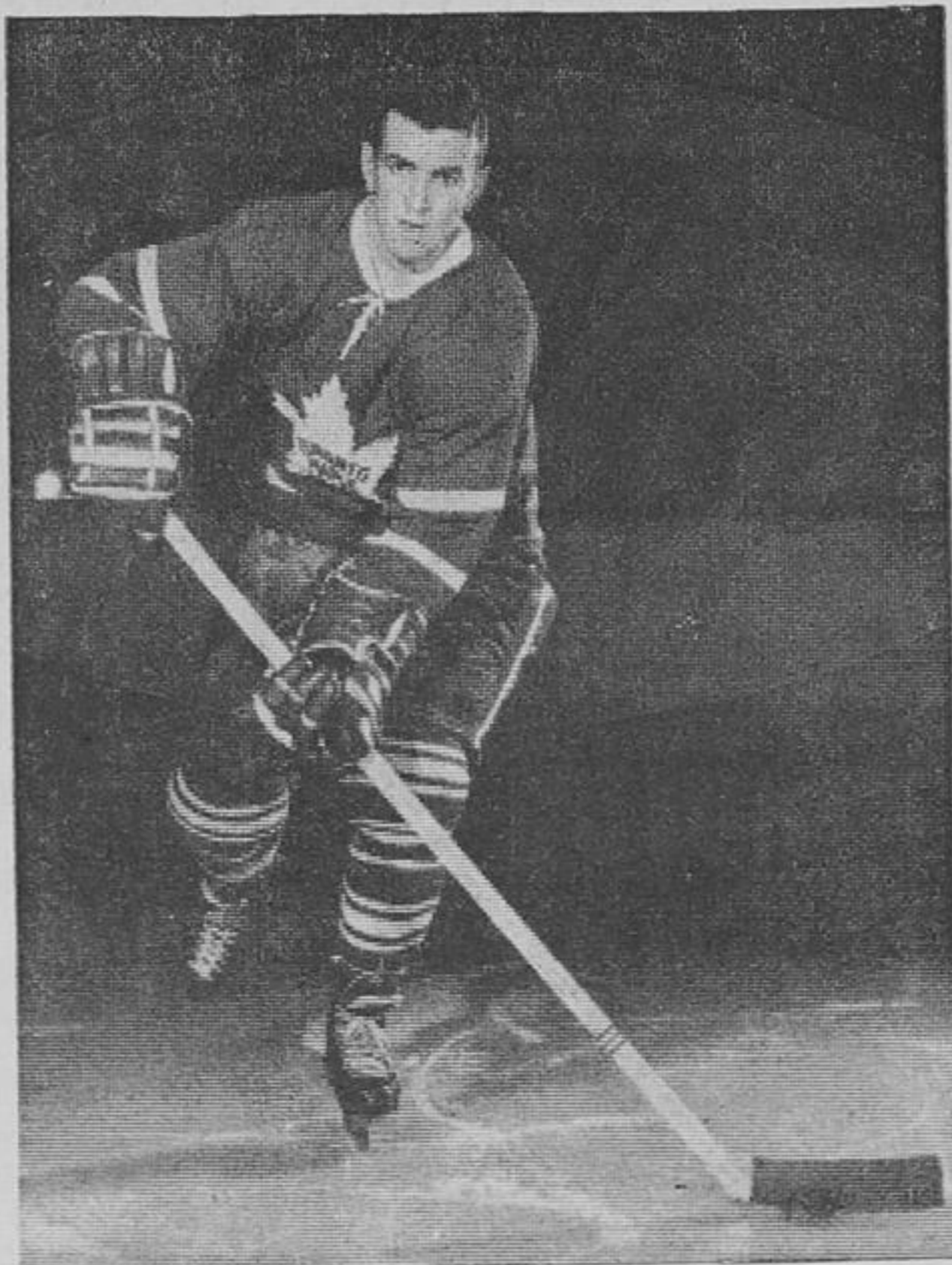
