## Will Seek Funds To Further Aims Of Conservation

Conservation costs money and the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority has set up a conservation foundation to seek badly-needed funds and other gifts for the advancement of conservation education and allied projects in the Metro region, it was announced this week.

The foundation is now in its second year, and under the chairmanship of Toronto insurance executive Fred A. Wade, it has already raised an encouraging amount of money, purchased the Percy A. Band pioneer toy collection now on display at the Authority's Dalziel Museum, and is processing a bequest of land, buildings and priceless art collection of a Kleinburg, Ont. couple, Mr. and Mrs. Robert McMichael.

Among the specific immediate objectives are: assistance for construction and equipping of a special conservation education centre which would be located in the Albion Hills conservation area and to be available for Metro and district junior high school students throughout the school year and continuing development of the Pioneer Village at Jane Street and Steeles Avenue.

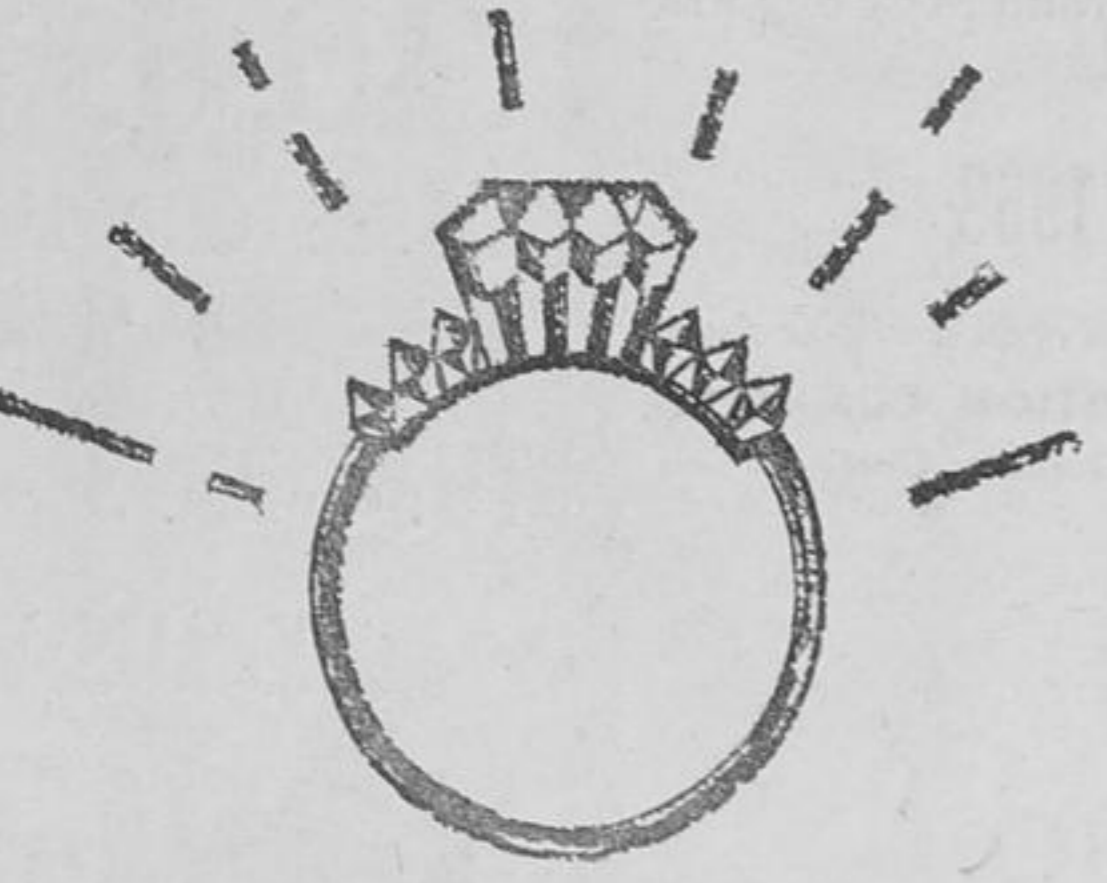
