1st Beverley Acres Scout Troop
Cubs Chris Hurst and Gary
Parsons were invested into the
"World Wide Brotherhood of
Scouting" at the November
13th meeting of the 1st Bever-
ley Acres Scout Troop, with
Scoutmaster Norman Foster of-
ficiating, assisted by Rover
Skipper Graeme Gould.
With 100% present - all 38
of them - training and practice
in the rescue program was en-
gaged in, and several excellent
films depicting every phase of
the work, were shown. So in-

peep out of any of them" said
the Scoutmaster.
Practical training was stepped
up at Tuesday night's meet-

Scouts Will Have Say On New
Design Uniforms
Boy Scouts of Canada will
have a say in what uniforms
they will in future be wearing.
The National Executive Com-
mittee of the Boy Scouts of

Canada has accepted the prin-
ciple that the boy membership
should be given a choice, and
that there should be greater
distinction in dress between the
three Sections of Scouting -
Cubs, Scouts and Rovers, it was
announced by Fred J. Finlay,
Chief Executive Commissioner
at National Scout Headquar-
ters in Ottawa.
It is of interest to note that
provision has been made for
equal use of navy blue long
trousers and shorts for Scouts,
Rovers, and adult leaders. The
decisions will be made for in-
dividual Groups by the Councils
of boy leaders.
Among other innovations, the
alternative use of red, berets
was authorized for the senior
section, Rover Scouts. A special
uniform for use by Canada's
contingent to 11th World Scout
Jamboree in Greece next Aug-
ust, was also approved by the
National Executive Committee.
Including a less formal shirt -
light sand in colour - with
green corduroy shorts, it will
be used with the present Scout
uniform.
The study of Canadian Scout
uniforms is continuing.
