

Mail Delivery Monday

(by Doris M. FitzGerald) At 9 o'clock on Monday morning, November 19, an interesting little ceremony was held in front of the Thornhill Post Office on Yonge St., to mark an historic occasion - the inauguration of door to door mail delivery by letter carriers. After 'O Canada' had been sung to recorded music, the invocation was given by the Rev. Minton Johnston of Thornhill Baptist Church, and Mr. J. G. Fulze, district director of the postal services, who acted as chairman, spoke briefly. Reeve Albert Rutherford of Vaughan Township then cut the ribbons strung across the doorway of the post office, and released the trimly uniformed letter carriers, who began their new duties at once. The first letter delivered was handed to Reeve W. R. Dean of Markham Township, on the spot, by Postman Gordon Holmes of Thornhill, who also had a second letter for Reeve Albert Rutherford of Vaughan Township. Mr. Dean read aloud his letter from Mrs. Ellen Fairclough, the Postmaster General. It brought good wishes; outlined the benefits to be shared by every citizen of Thornhill as a result of the new service. and described Thornhill as the 183rd post office in Canada from which door-to-door


