From One Store To Six Is Mac's Success Story

On December 8, 1961 three young men opened a milk and grocery convenience store at 30 Levendale Road in Richmond Hill. These young men had no experience in this field but had observed the growth and success of similar stores in Toronto and the United States. They felt there was an unfulfilled need for this type of operation in Canada. They searched southern Ontario for a location in a centre which was versatile and metropolitan enough in its outlook to accept this new way of Milk merchandising. Looking at the Hamilton area they found that the Stoney Creek Dairies had already opened a number of such stores thus fulfilling that area's need. Continuing their search they finally settled on Richmond Hill as being an ideal location.

With no experience and very little money but plenty of optimism and ambition they opened their store. Mac's Milk with its discount milk prices and - open till 11 p.m. 7 days a week policy - fulfilled a need in Richmond Hill because the residents reacted by patronizing the store in ever increasing numbers. For the first three months the three employees of Mac's Milk - who had renovated, built fixtures, and operated the store in their spare time - continued to work at their previous business to make ends meet.

The continued increase in volume at the store encouraged their belief that there was a definite need for this type of service store in certain areas. Then came the big decision - whether to take a chance and devote their full time and energy to Mac's Milk or not. The three young men decided to forge ahead and started looking for suitable locations. The result is that now, one year later what started out as a small one shop experiment in Richmond Hill, is Mac's Milk Limited - a small chain with six stores operating in and around Metropolitan Toronto.

As long as they continue to get patronage and encouragement from their customers - it is their intention to continue opening more stores in the near future.

Bought From Builder Claims Reeve Unethical

Deputy-reeve Lawson Mumberson of Markham Township, who is opposing incumbent Wilfred Dean for the reeve's chair next month, lashed out at Mr. Dean Monday for buying a home from a subdivider the township is still negotiating with.

Representatives of the firm claimed neighboring subdividers have been allowed to combine their storm and sanitary sewers.

"This is one of the most unethical pieces of business I have ever heard of in municipal politics", Mr. Mumberson charged. Mr. Mumberson's attack came after representatives of the Colmur Subdivision appeared before council, asking for permission to empty their storm sewage into the subdivision's sanitary sewers.

Recently the township's policy has been to prohibit the emptying of weeping tile into the sanitary sewage system. Complaints of flooding of sanitary sewers after a heavy rainfall have been common. In addition, Markham must pay to have its entire sewage output treated by Metropolitan Toronto, including storm sewage.

Only Seven File 30 Is Tops For Eight Seats On School Board

Only seven candidates filed papers for eight seats on the Richmond Hill Public School Board at Monday's nominations in the high school auditorium. Another nomination meeting will be held December 6 between 8 and 9 p.m. at the municipal hall in an effort to find a candidate for the second position in Ward 1.

Principals of Crosby Heights and Beverley Acres Public School have been instructed to refuse admission to more than 30 pupils per class in their kindergartens. Richmond Hill Public School Board authorized the principals to take this action Thursday night, as a result of a suggestion from Superintendent Gordon McIntyre.

"There are fewer school children passing this location than that of any other applicant," he added.
