## New Conservation Building

Architect's sketch of conservation facility to be built by the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority in its Albion Hills conservation area. Building is expected to be completed by next September. Ground-breaking ceremonies were carried out recently by Ontario Education Minister Hon. W. G. Davis. It will accommodate about 45 students and teaching staff at a time and is designed to be used by metro and region senior elementary and high school students as a conservation education facility. Students will attend school for one week's on-the-site training. It is expected to be used in non-school season by other groups.

**"Are you in favour of moving pictures after 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon of the Lord's Day to be regulated by Municipal By-law under the authority of the Lord's Day (Ontario) Act 1960-61?"**

is a correct statement of the question which will be submitted to the electors of the Township of Vaughan for their opinion under the authority of By-Law No. 2743.

The votes will be taken at the municipal election on December 8, 1962 between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. (Local Time) at the polling places designated for the Municipal election.

Any persons who wish to be appointed to attend at the polling places and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk on behalf of the persons voting in the affirmative or negative on the question, shall be present at the office of the Clerk on the 3rd day of December, 1962, at the hour of 10:00 a.m. (Local Time).
