### J. Addison M.P. Tells Liberal Women Of Futility In Parliament At Ottawa

John Addison, Federal M.P. for York North, was the guest speaker Monday of last week when the York North Women's Liberal Association held a Christmas banquet for approximately 80 guests at the Veterans' Hall, Newmarket.

In his remarks, Mr. Addison dealt briefly and with humour on his early experiences in Ottawa, before proceeding to the more vital matters which confront Canada today.

"This parliament is a very tense one," said the speaker. "Splinter parties are the rule in the present year. After the new year heat will be intense."

"Canadians," said the speaker, "are a much more tolerant people than Americans, but the boiling point is being reached."

Mrs. Lida Kirkwood of Aurora, president of York North Women's Liberal Association was chairman for the evening, and she was presented with a birthday cake which was later shared with the guests.
