

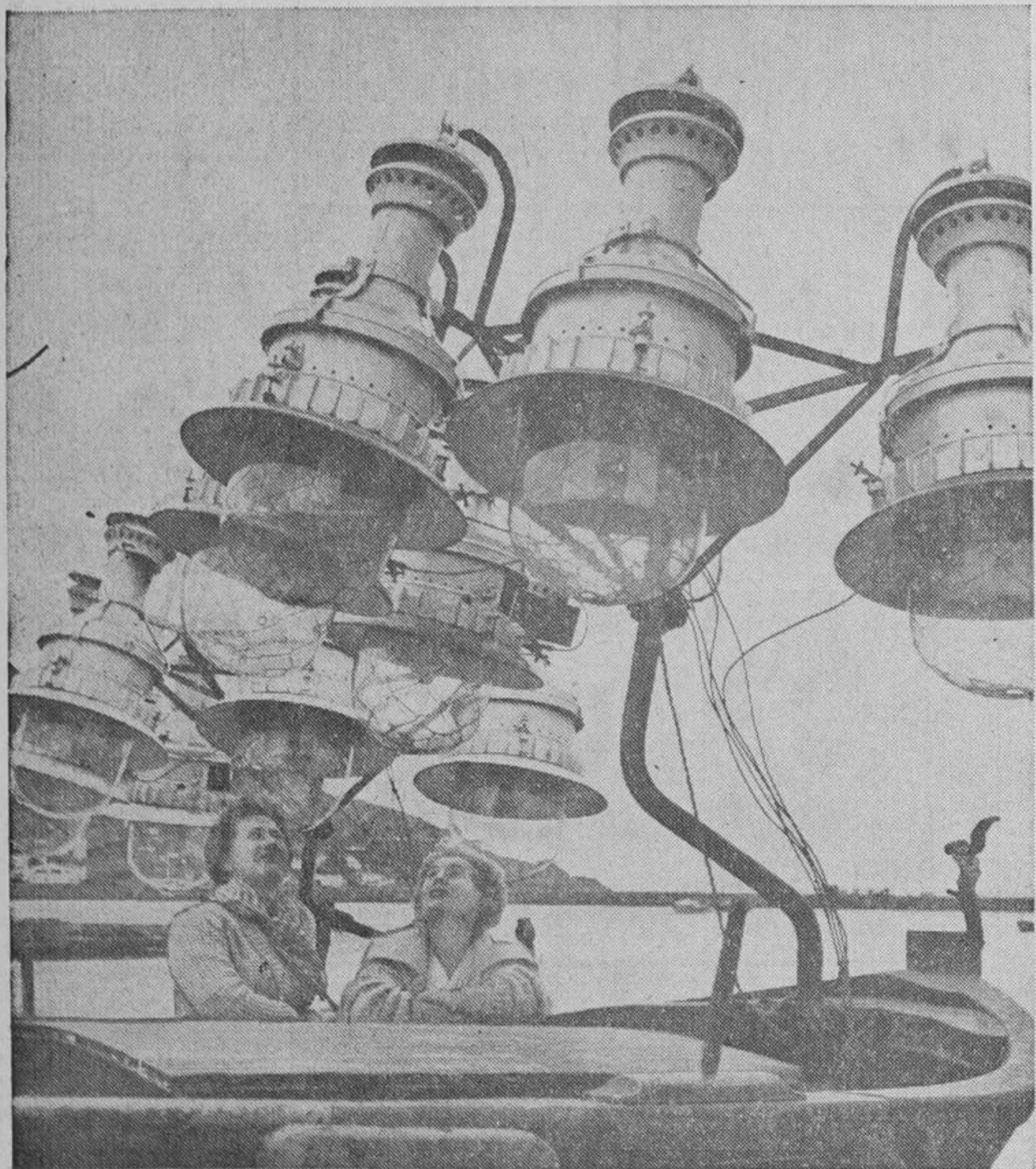

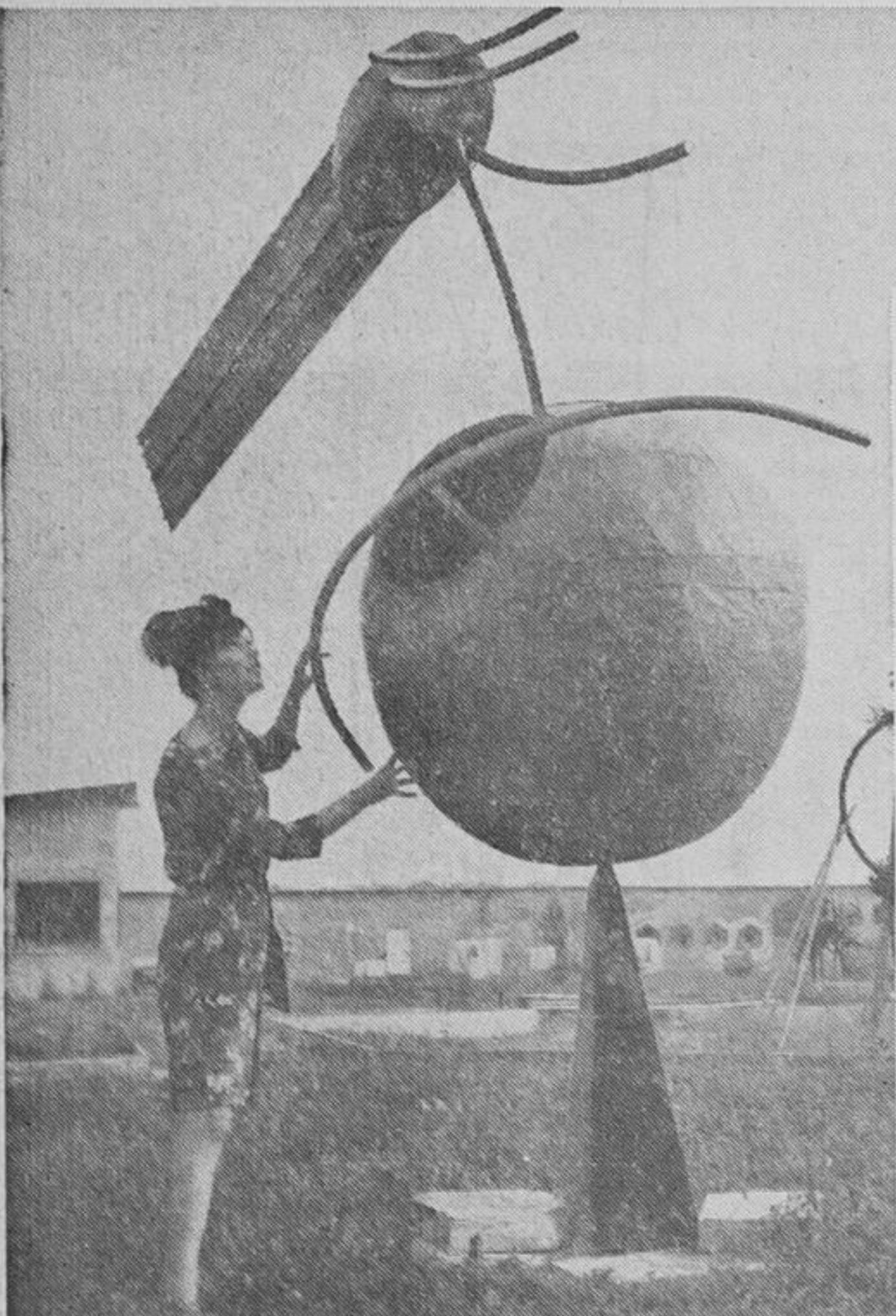
WAGON TRAINED—Jeff Brandon takes Angel, his pal, along wherever he goes in Nashville, Tenn. They're on paper route.

OPEN AIR ARTISTS

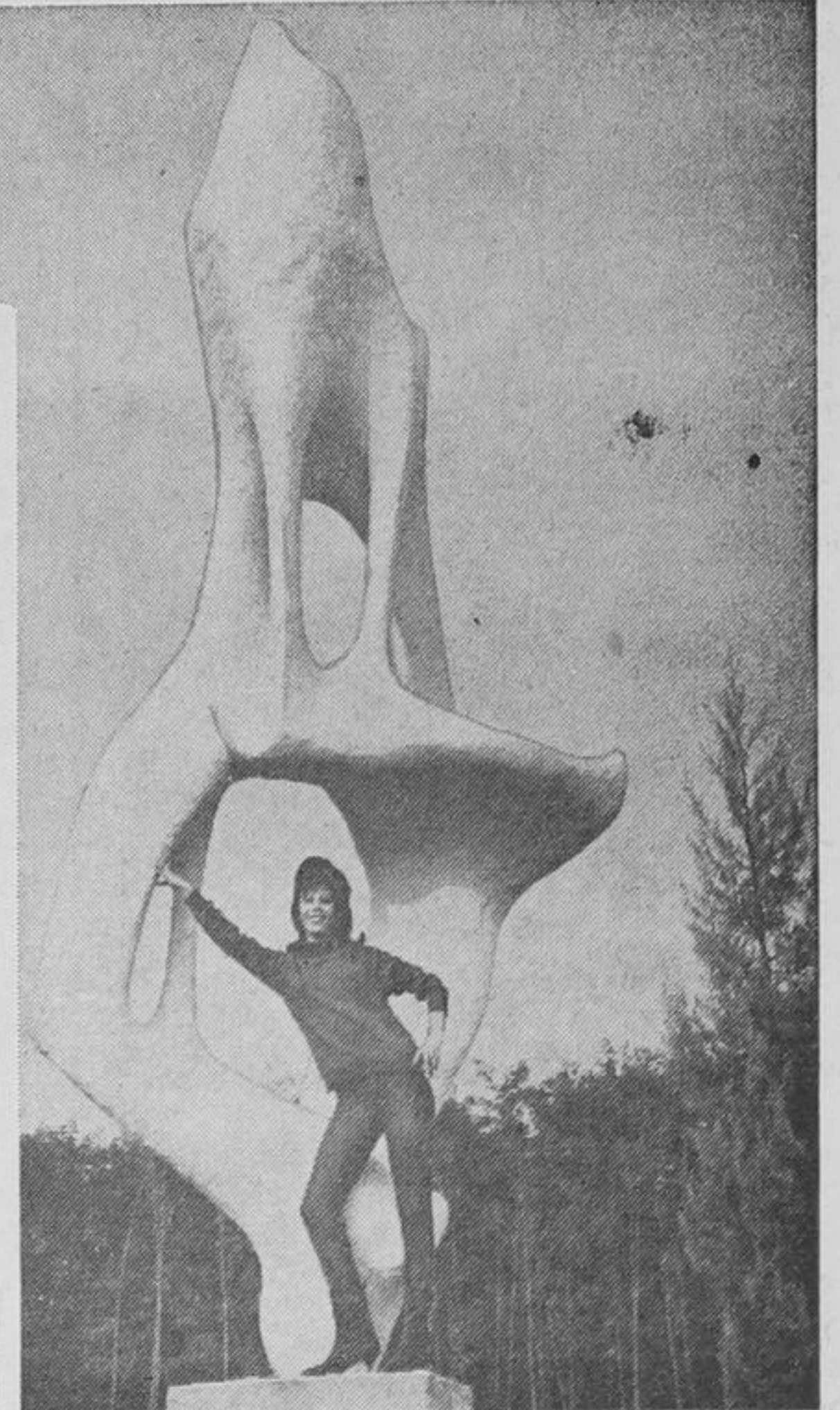
MODERN ART is using modern methods to attract visitors in Legnano, Italy. Gallery director Enzo Pagani is bringing art to the people in a natural setting of grass, trees and rocks. The outdoor art museum is a labyrinth of twisted bars, contorting bronze, stone slabs and shaggy space monsters. They are the nucleus of what will be a large permanent exhibit of modernistic sculpture. While viewing the stone and metal works of art by 260 contemporary sculptors, visitors can picnic.
