The bi-monthly plaque was presented to Area Manager, L. J. Roy in the presence of the Richmond Hill Rural Operating Area staff at a meeting in the Richmond Hill area office. In making the presentation, Adam S. Smith, central region manager, offered his congratulations to the entire Richmond Hill area staff on a job well done.

He pointed out that it is extremely important for Hydro men and women to get out and promote wider use of electricity on the farm. We have an excellent product, Mr. Smith said, and we should do our best to encourage farm customers to benefit by the use of more electrical equipment.
