Serves As Volunteer

District Youth Heads "Y" In New Amsterdam

Less than a year ago, Alan Duffield, a member of St. Paul's United Church, Lake Wilcox, was accepted as a volunteer to serve for 12 months in British Guiana. He has been in the colony since July.

A recent letter received by Rev. Gordon Winch from Mr. Duffield described some of the work he had been involved in. Although he had only a Grade 13 education, he was placed in charge of the New Amsterdam YMCA. During his stay there, the "Y" has grown from a membership of three teenagers to over 290 youngsters. Activities include sports, crafts and creative activity.

Mr. Duffield teaches English three mornings a week at sugar estates, and mathematics to clerks and typists two mornings a week.

New Amsterdam is a city of over 25,000 with all the typical South American problems of unemployment, depressed housing, and tense racial conditions.

The people of the country are very generous, according to Mr. Duffield. He has been made welcome by "everyone from the Prime Minister, Dr. Cheddi Jagan, down to the smallest American Indian boy."

Juvenile delinquency is a problem in New Amsterdam because youngsters have little to do after school and during holidays, have small homes and few recreation centres like the YMCA.

On Christmas day, Mr. Duffield had a party for orphans who are not part of the regular "Y" program. Over 200 boys for softball equipment, old magazines and used postage stamps as well as money to help Mr. Church officials are looking Duffield in his work.
