(Continued From Page 1) ideas, which is a healthy sign. Many things attract their attention. A film "Frustrating Fours and Fascinating Fives" was recommended. At this age when attention is so easily distracted, and flits from one interesting thing to another, a helping hand along the way is needed, along with di-

rection. Getting him started

on the job of his snowsuit, or shoes, or toys being put away is the step for parents to take, although he may do most of the task himself.

Learning is a continuous thing; you can learn all the time. In summing up, Mrs. Hewson stated that even adults are only accomplishing about one-half of their potential. Emotions hold us back as uncertainty enters

the picture, and this can often be traced back to the amount of encouragement received. Use as few rules as possible carrying them through making sure to revise them to fit age and development.
