### Accuse Town Of Hiding Details

(Continued From Page 1)  
of Pleasantville at any meet-  
ing with Richmond Hill.  
Members of the Richmond  
Hill works committee are Mayor  
William Neal, Reeve Floyd  
Perkins, Deputy-reeve Stan Tin-  
ker and Councillor Al White.  
Reeve Rutherford called for  
further investigation of the  
problem. "We don't want to do  
anything to hurt the hospital or  
to damage our relations with  
Richmond Hill," Reeve Ruther-  
ford said, "but I don't think  
we should be made suckers of."  
The Richvale ratepayers who  
attended the meeting presented  
a petition which warned that  
"pollution... might be caused  
by reason of power failure or  
over-loading now and in the  
future."  
A spokesman explained that  
the proposed underground tank

did not have enough capacity  
to hold up in event of a power  
stoppage. He warned that the  
tank could easily overflow be-  
fore an emergency generator  
could be put to work.  
"The type of sewage pro-  
duced by a hospital would be  
especially dangerous,"  
he explained.  
Also included in the petition  
was a suggestion that "any ad-  
dition to the sewage load from  
other than the hospital, be a  
subject of future agreement be-  
tween Vaughan Township and  
any other municipality."  
Council earlier objected to  
installing a looped watermain  
to serve the hospital. Councillor  
Ruth McConkey explained  
installation of a straight main  
would result in saving of \$10,000  
to Vaughan Township.

## Destination — Berlin

Members of the Vancouver  
— Berlin Peace Campaign  
spent Tuesday night in Rich-  
mond Hill. They are taking  
part in a 6,000 mile peace  
walk from Vancouver to Ber-  
lin, designed to aid the cause  
of nuclear disarmament.  
Hans Sinn, 33, a German  
writer, Lorne Bennett, 21,  
Vancouver factory worker,  
and Peter Light, 20, a Van-  
couver student, surround the  
1946 Chevrolet they are driv-  
ing across Canada.  
They take turns walking  
and driving the car, averaging  
40 miles a day. The walk  
began September 30.  
The three will spend about  
two weeks in this part of  
Ontario. The walk is being  
paid for by the walkers, by  
local peace groups and by  
private citizens.  
They expect to arrive in  
Britain by April and travel  
through Scandinavia and  
East and West Germany to  
reach Berlin.

### Dimes Drive Up Six Per Cent Over Last Year

Preliminary reports from  
Chairman Mrs. Norman  
Todd of the local March of  
Dimes Campaign indicated  
an increase of about six per  
cent in the amount collect-  
ed in Richmond Hill and  
Richvale this year.  
An estimated \$3,200 was  
collected in Monday night's  
annual one hour blitz. Com-  
parative figure for 1962 was  
about \$3,000.  
Funds raised in the  
March of Dimes provide  
medical and vocational re-  
habilitation for handicap-  
ped men and women.  
Six rehabilitation cen-  
tres at Toronto, Ottawa,  
Hamilton, Windsor, King-  
ston and the Lakehead are  
supported by the drive.
