## Rabbit Hunting Closed Feb. 28 In South Area

The open season for rabbits in the southern part of the Lake Simcoe District closed February 28.

For information of hunters the dividing line between the northern and southern part of the district, for rabbit seasons, is the north boundary of Dufferin County, Tossoronto, Essa and Innisfil Townships east of Barrie, then following the south shoreline of Lake Simcoe easterly to Port Bolster, south along the westerly boundary of Brock Township and thence easterly along the south boundary of Brock Township to the boundary between Victoria and Ontario Counties.

Areas north of this boundary line close, for rabbits, March 31.

Special township licences in the district expired February 28 and the resident hunting licence will only be valid in areas in the northern part of the district and will not expire until June 15.

Sportsmen who wish to hunt in the southern part of the district after February 28 must obtain a resident licence to hunt from March 1st to August 31. This licence may be obtained from licence issuers and is valid for one county only.

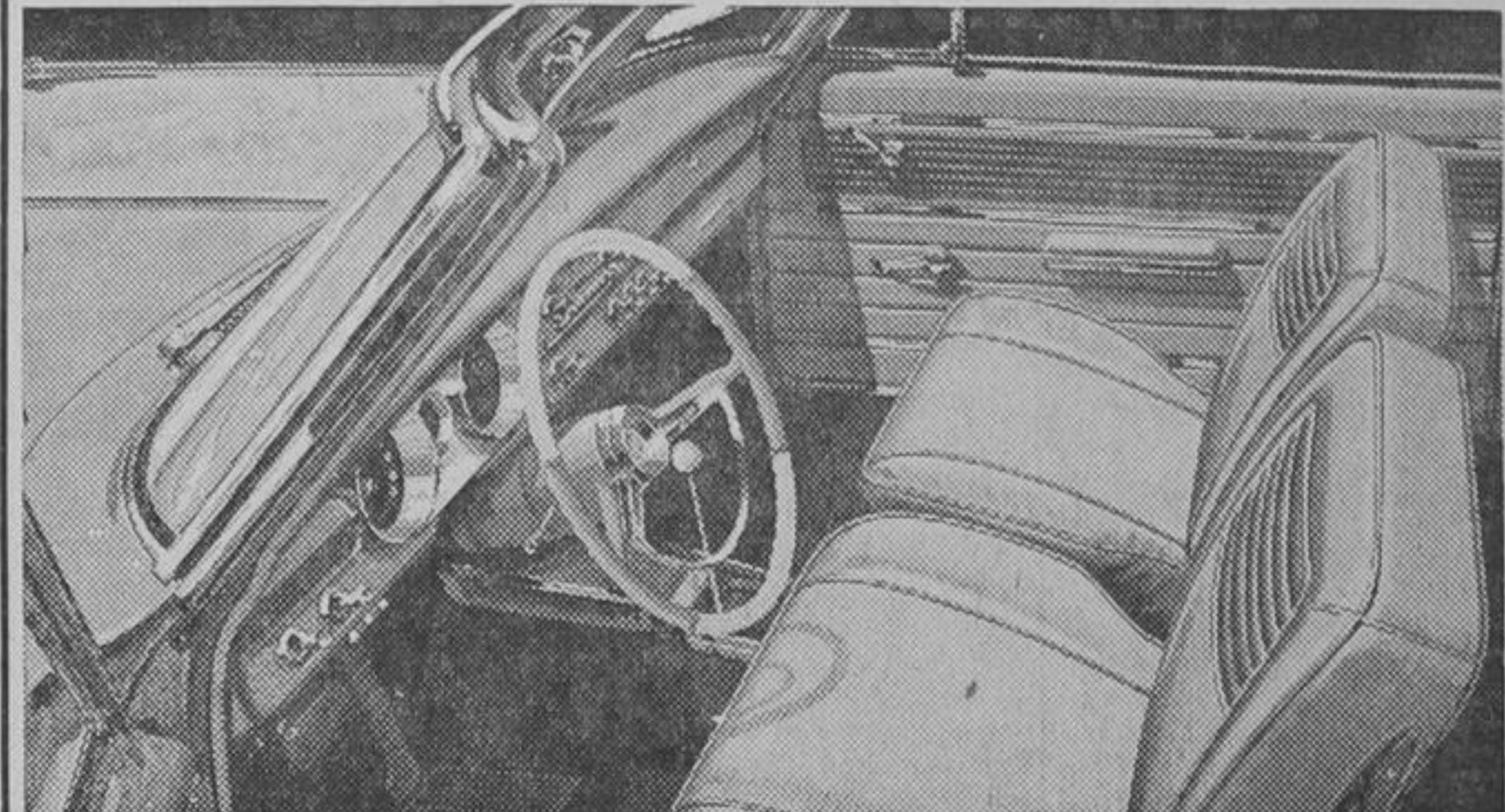
