

### York - Scarboro Federal Candidates

All four political parties have nominated candidates in York-Scarboro riding for the April 8 federal election. With over 500 polls, this riding is the largest in Canada.

Markham Township residents living south of No. 7 Highway will wote in York-Scarboro on April 8. There are 17 federal polls lying in that part of Markham included in this riding.

The four candidates are seen above at an election rally held last week at Agincourt. Left to right, they are: Maurice Moreau, Liberal; Alex Ford, Social Credit; Ed. Phillips, N.D.P., and Frank McGee, Progressive Conservative. Mr. McGee, who has represented the riding since 1957, was recently appointed Minister Without Portfolio in the Diefenbaker Government. Mr. Moreau, who is again carrying the Liberal banner, came a close second in the voting last June.
