### Richmond Hill

#### Symphony Give Fine Concert

The Richmond Hill Symphony Orchestra under the very capable baton of Arthur Burgin, played another of its planned concerts on Sunday night, April 7th. This one was for the several members from Newmarket and was held in the very gracious auditorium of the Greenacres Home.

The total strength of the orchestra now is almost 50 and for once the stage was large enough to accommodate all members at one time.

Mayor Bert Kent spoke before the concert and thanked the orchestra for bringing this form of entertainment and recreation to so many people and then introduced the narrator of the orchestra Mr. Dennis Thatcher.

Vocal soloist of the evening was Mrs. Alma Stephens of Newmarket who is also a member of the orchestra. Her accompanist was Mrs. Beth Harwood on the piano and in the song "At Dawning" George Moseley played the violin obligato. For one of the vocal solos "Brown Bird Singing" Mr. Burgin conducted an orchestral accompaniment.

Orchestral numbers on the evening's fare were Toccata by Frescobaldi, L'Arlesienne Suite by Bizet, Slavonic Dances by Dvorak, Schubert Unfinished Symphony and several other smaller works.

Most noticeable effect of the evening was the orchestra's performance of the Schubert Unfinished Symphony. With the full orchestra employed, this work perhaps was the first real "music" produced to date where, in the creation of an orchestra in such early stages, something more than just reading notes was attained.

The next concert is planned for Aurora in early May and later that month, a final concert in Richmond Hill.

Although the orchestra at present is known as the Richmond Hill Symphony, these outside concerts are aimed towards membership from other districts and also to repay present members of the orchestra who come from these other areas.

### Yk. - Scarborough Voting

That part of Markham Township lying south of No. 7 Highway is included in the federal riding of York-Scarboro. There are a total of 17 polls in that part of the riding. Maurice Moreau, Liberal, carried 14 of the 17 polls Monday, while Conservative Frank McGee led in only three of them.

Mr. Moreau's decisive lead in Markham Township carried right through the whole riding as he sent Tory McGee down to defeat. Mr. McGee who was a Minister Without Portfolio in the Diefenbaker Cabinet had represented the riding in Ottawa since 1957.

### High Schools Will Fly The "Red Duster"

Another step in the evolution of the disappearance of the Union Jack from the Canadian scene was approved at the April 9 meeting of the York Central District High School Board when it was decided that the Red Ensign would be flown at all high schools in the district when present stocks of the Union Jack are depleted.

The Red Ensign, officially the colours of the British Merchant Marine, and for some years past the adopted flag of Canada, will be the flag that will be purchased in the future for all high schools in the district.

The decision brings to mind the words that appeared on the fly-leaf page of public school readers that were in use a generation ago. They were: One Flag, One Crown, One Throne. The words, as many will recall, were displayed under a full-colour illustration of the Union Jack.

The motion to adopt the Red Ensign was carried without dissent.
