Will Concentrate On Road Repairs

Road work to be undertaken by the Town of Richmond Hill during the coming year will consist in the main of repairing existing thoroughfares Otto Whalen told 'The Liberal' this week.

In effect this will mean in many cases the scarifying of the roads to eliminate frost bubbles, re-grading and resurfacing.

The only new construction that will be undertaken by the town will be continuation of Enford Road to the Elgin Mills Road and the completion of new construction on Crosby, Newkirk and Centre Streets that was begun last year.

In speaking to 'The Liberal' Mr. Whalen emphasized that work on the roads could not commence before the temperature of the road foundations reached 55 degrees. According to some members of council this may be another month or longer.

Estimates for road work submitted to council in the recently tabled budget, Mr. Whalen said, will be forwarded to the Ontario Department of Highways for their approval and concurrence prior to the granting of provincial subsidies.
