

**Vaughan Calls April 28-May 4**

**Road Tenders**

Residents on rural roads can look forward to relief from dust during the coming season. Tenders have been called by Vaughan Township Road Committee (Chairman Councillor G. W. Keffer) for the supply of calcium chloride.

Other business conducted at last week's meeting of the road committee was the recommendation that Township Engineer G. K. Hopper prepare specifications prior to calling tenders for road improvements in Sylvanene subdivision. The latter is located north of No. 7 Highway and just east of Woodbridge.

Following an inspection by Councillor Keffer and Road Superintendent Nelson Kerr the Yongehurst Road culvert will be cleared of silt, and the ditches cleaned.

**MARKHAM**: A rural highway safety display competition is planned by the Ontario County Farm Safety Council. Main purpose of the contest is to get ideas that can be incorporated into a rural highway safety display. The contest is open to all residents of Ontario.

**Mental Health Week Offers Full Program**

A full schedule of activities has been planned for Mental Health Week in York County, which starts April 28 and ends May 4th reports Mrs. Florence Murray, of Aurora, chairman of the 1963 program.

Opening day will have a film festival at 8 p.m. at the Newmarket Plaza auditorium, followed by open house at the York County Mental Health Clinic. The latter is also located in the shopping plaza.

Fairmead School for retarded children in Newmarket will be the scene of an open house on April 30 during the evening. Principal is Miss Margaret Moore.

The following day, May 1, Dr. R. D. Buckner, psychiatric consultant, will answer questions at the House of Concord. This is operated by the Salvation Army. Again the program will be in the evening from 7:00 to 9:30 p.m.

However, on the same day between 10:00 a.m. and noon

Vaughan Township Council on recommendation of its planning and building committee (Chairman Deputy-reeve J. Bryson) has granted 1963 licenses to eight township motels.

Receiving licenses were: Emerald Isle 14 units; Twin Elms 9; Thorncrest 20; Summit 18; New Woodbine 19; Hoover 17; Colonial 15; and Cher-edale Motel 18 Units.

**Will Concentrate On Road Repairs**

Road work to be undertaken by the Town of Richmond Hill during the coming year will consist in the main of repairing existing thoroughfares Otto Whalen told 'The Liberal' this week.

In effect this will mean in many cases the scarifying of the roads to eliminate frost bunnies, re-grading and re-surfacing.

The only new construction that will be undertaken by the town will be continuation of Enford Road to the Elgin Mills Road and the completion of new construction on Crosby, Newkirk and Centre Streets that was begun last year.

In speaking to 'The Liberal' Mr. Whalen emphasized that work on the roads could not commence before the temperature of the road foundations reached 55 degrees. According to some members of council this may be another month or longer.

Estimates for road work submitted to council in the recently tabled budget, Mr. Whalen said, will be forwarded to the Ontario Department of Highways for their approval and concurrence prior to the granting of provincial subsidies.

RE LIQUOR LICENCE ACT VOTE

**THE MUNICIPALITY OF TOWNSHIP OF VAUGHAN**

Public notice is hereby given, that in accordance with the provisions of The Liquor Licence Act, and in pursuance of a by-law passed by the municipal council of the Township of Vaughan on the 1st day of April, 1963, I require the presence of the voters at the Township Municipal Building in the Village of Maple on the 27th day of April, 1963, at one o'clock in the afternoon, Standard Time, at which time I will announce the names of the persons appointed to act for the Affirmative and for the Negative respectively upon the poll to be holden under Section 72 of the Liquor Licence Act, upon the following questions,

Are you in favour of the establishment of government stores for the sale of liquor?

Are you in favour of the sale of liquor under a dining lounge licence for consumption with meals on licensed premises?

And notice is further given that the vote will be taken on the same questions, in the manner provided by law at a poll to be opened on the 11th day of May, 1963

from the hour of 8 o'clock in the forenoon until 7 o'clock in the afternoon (Standard Time) at the following places:

**Polling Division No. 6 (Urban):** Comprising that part of the Township bounded on the South and West by the Township Limits; on the North by the centre line of No. 7 Highway; and on the East by the easterly limits of Concession No. 7; excluding the Village of Woodbridge. **Polling Station at Lower Ninth School.**

**Polling Division No. 7 (Urban):** Comprising that part of the Township bounded on the South by the Township Limits; on the West by the westerly limit of Concession No. 6; on the North by the centre line of No. 7 Highway; and on the East commencing where the south limit of the Township is intersected by the Canadian National Railway right-of-way, thence continuing northerly along the said right-of-way to where it is intersected by the centre line of Rockview Gardens, thence westerly along the centre line of Rockview Gardens to the centre line of Keele Street, thence northerly along the centre line of Keele Street to Highway No. 7. **Polling Station at Edgely School.**
