## Lutherans Form Canadian Body Church In America

Local Lutheran congregations offered special prayers of thanksgiving Sunday following the organization of the Canada section of the Lutheran Church in America.

Lutherans from six provinces met in First Lutheran Church, Toronto, last week to found the new body. It brings together three Lutheran synods including 125,000 members in 360 congregations throughout the dominion.

Convenor was Dr. Franklin C. Fry, president of the Lutheran Church in America and chairman of the World Council of Churches. The Rev. Hugh Whitteker of Bridgewater, N.S. was elected president of the Canada section.

The Canada section will coordinate Lutheran activities in the dominion and give Canadian members of the LCA a common voice. It will also serve as a common planning agency for new congregations.

Delegates from eastern Canada were polled as to their preference for the headquarters city for the Eastern Canada Synod. The synod, a member of the Canada section, includes the area east of Geraldton, Ont.

Philip Barth of Richmond Hill is secretary of a special committee preparing a recommendation concerning the headquarters location. It is generally felt that a move of the location from Kitchener to Toronto would open up more opportunity for co-operation with other major Canadian church bodies.

The headquarters committee held its final meeting Tuesday in Kitchener. It will report to the synodical convention at Waterloo, June 4-6.

Although lacking large numbers in York County today, the Lutheran church was among the pioneer faiths of the area. Zion Lutheran Church, Sherwood, south of Maple, was organized in 1806 and was the site of the organization of the synod over one hundred years ago.

Bethesda Lutheran Church in Unionville is among the oldest congregations in central York County, dating from 1794. A pioneer Lutheran church in Buttonville has disappeared in recent years.

St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Richmond Hill, is one of dozens of new mission congregations planted across Ontario in recent years. It was organized last year by its present pastor, the Rev. Albert E. Myers.

The convention of the Canada section also directed its executive committee to study the implications of membership in the Canadian Council of Churches. Lutherans have been leading proponents of inter-church co-operation in the World Council of Churches and the National Council of Churches in the U.S.

Membership in the Canadian Council of Churches has proved impossible due to the lack of a semi-autonomous section of the church in the dominion and two deviations from basic ecumenical principles on the part of the council.

The first hurdle has now been passed. The new body's executive committee must determine whether or not the next hurdle can be overcome.

The principles are usually called that of "representation" and that of "evangelicalism." The Lutheran Church refuses to allow its representatives to sit in a par with persons representing only themselves or at best non-church bodies (such as the Bible Society, YMCA, etc.).

The representative principle would therefore require the legislative body of any inter-church agency to be comprised only of representatives of church bodies in ratio to their membership figures.

The evangelical principle means that Lutherans cannot cooperate unless the agency explicitly confesses faith in Jesus Christ as divine Lord and Saviour.

The Lutheran Church in America is "in friendly association" with the Canadian Council of Churches, sending observers to its meetings. Delegates to the Canada section convention expressed hope that full membership would soon be possible.
