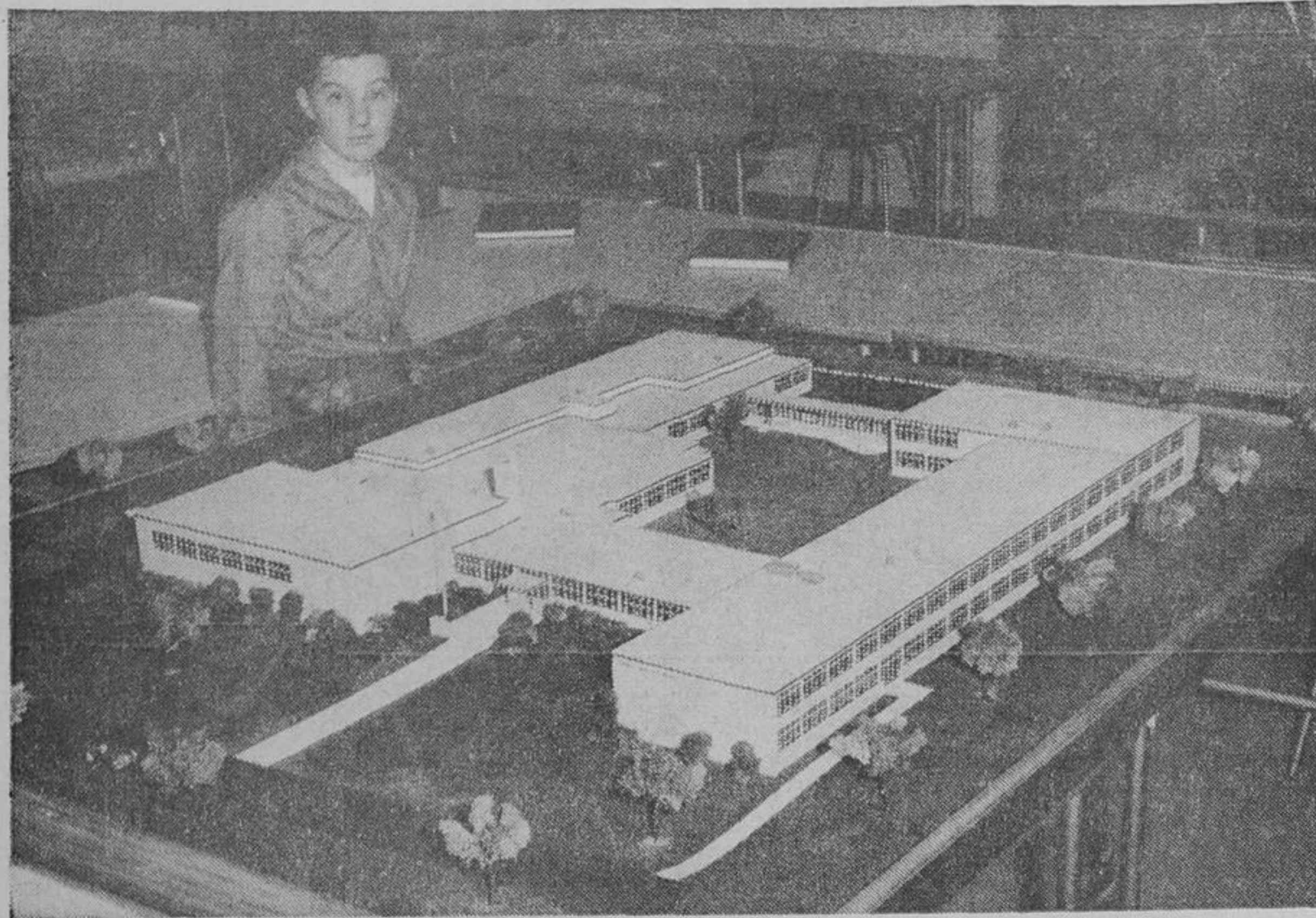

Scuba display drew many interested spectators all evening. Instructor Reg. Winstall (pointing) answers some of the many questions.

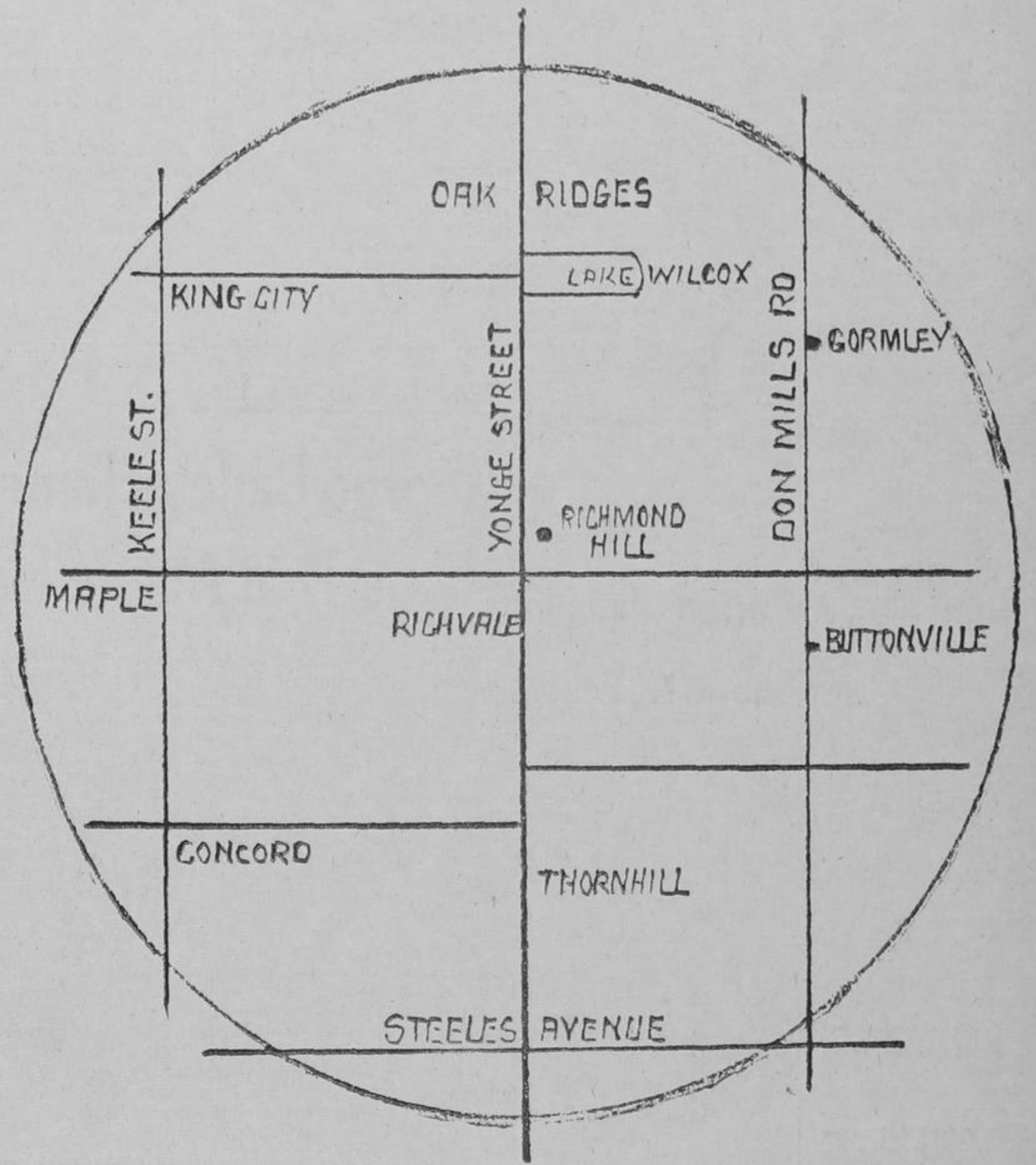
