Markham Twp. Council To Consider Recreation Area

Two delegations from the southwestern section of the township waited on Markham Township Council Monday evening.

A. Secord of Elgin Street was spokesman for the first group from the Woodland School district, which asked for assistance in the construction and operation of two outdoor rinks during the winter. Mr. Secord identified himself as rink committee chairman of the home and school of Woodland School, and reported that last winter \$250 had been expended on equipment and 25 fathers had given 200 man hours to construct and flood the rinks. A pleasure skating rink and a hockey cushion provided pleasure for the pupils of Woodland, hockey leagues and children from a wide area, so that they were really community rinks, and the work entailed had proved too much for the volunteer help of fathers.

Mr. Bill Menzies of the Thornhill and District Hockey League reported that 100 boys from that league had used the hockey rink. He stated it was a tremendous asset to the boys in the Thornhill area.

Reeve W. R. Dean agreed that there should be a rink in the area, and that it would be wiser to spend some money on recreation for the boys now than maintain a place of detention for them in later years. The reeve felt that the time had come to set up a parks committee for the whole township to provide recreational facilities.

Mr. Menzies reported that in the same area 25 teams, including 250 boys, will be operating in a softball league this summer. Fifty men will be needed to give direction to these 6 to 14-year-olds. Last year only 13 teams were in operation.

Council agreed to give immediate consideration to the problem at the Wednesday morning committee meeting.

Mr. A. E. Picton of 126 Clarke Avenue complained that the lot across from his residence on the southwest corners of Henderson and Clarke Avenues is being used for dumping purposes and looks like a public dump. The two-acre lot is becoming an increasing eyesore, he claimed. Clerk H. C. T. Crisp reported that he and the building inspector had looked over the situation, and it was his impression that apparently permission had been given to people to dump on the lot because what had been dumped was all building material.

The road department will be requested to put a ditch around the property to prevent dumping on motion of Councillor A. Sumner and Deputy-Reeve C. Hooper.

York County 4-H Clubs Hold Achievement Day

Interest was keen May 4 when the York County 4-H Homemaking Club achievement day was held in Aurora. Fourteen clubs presented exhibits, skills and demonstrations. In addition, each girl in the project, "What Shall I Wear?" modelled her blouse in the fashion parade. A total of 126 club members completed this project and their books and blouses were on display.

Clubs presenting exhibits were Agincourt, Bogartown, Buttonville, Nobleton, Queensville, Snowball, Vellore and Laskay. Skits and demonstrations were presented by Edgeley, Schomberg, South Vaughan, Teston, Vardorf and Temperanceville. The presentations showed the ability these girls have in working together and preparing very interesting programs. Mrs. Elton Armstrong, Federated Women's Institute of Ontario, provincial board director for subdivision 8, presented provincial honor certificates and pins, upon the completion of 12 homemaking club units to Brenda Glover, Bogartown Club; Sandra Burr, Buttonville Club; Helen Irwin, Nobleton Club; and Donna Seed, Vellore Club. These girls also received copies of the Britannica Book of the Year. County honors awarded on completion of six 4-H Club homemaking units were presented to 12 club members. Recipients were Carol Walsh, Queensville Club; Karen Barnes, Pat Woolner, Schomberg Club; Mary Fikkin, Ingelisse Hansen, Snowball Club; Connie Murray, Shirley Bowen and Dorothy Diceman, Teston Club; Linda Elias, Nancy Oliver, Ann Duncan and Sandra Tryon of the Vardorf Club. Certificates of achievement upon the completion of every second club unit were presented to 66 club members.

Assisting Mrs. C. B. Schneller, county home economist, were Miss Frances Lampman, clothing specialist, Home Economics Service, Toronto, and Miss Eileen McDermid, home economist for Oxford County.

"Cotton Accessories for the Club Girl's Bedroom" will be the next 4-H Homemaking Club unit to be taken in York County. This will begin in the fall with a local leader training school. New groups or persons who might be interested in organizing a homemaking club could write to the Home Economist, Ontario Department of Agriculture, Box 87, Newmarket.

B. M. & T. Hikes Rate on Saving Accounts

Rate of interest on British Mortgage savings accounts was today increased to four per cent, Wilfrid P. Gregory, Q.C., executive vice-president and managing director of the company announced. This is the first time that British Mortgage has paid four per cent on savings since prior to the second world war. It is also an increase of one half of one per cent over the rate which has remained steady at three and one half per cent since 1959.

Chequing privileges are allowed on British Mortgage savings accounts paying four per cent. Interest is computed half-yearly on minimum balances. As an introductory concession to this increased rate, British Mortgage has also announced that interest on new accounts opened by May 17 will be retroactive to May 1.

This increased interest rate should act as a stimulus to saving, Mr. Gregory said. Canadians are constantly seeking higher standards of living and this profitable means of saving is the most desirable way to acquire consumer goods.
