Mrs. Humphreys was born at Castlemore in Toronto Gore and lived her early years at Artemesia in Grey County, Ontario, and at Woodbridge. After her marriage they farmed in Vaughan Township until coming to Richmond Hill in '43.

Born at King Creek near Laskay and the eldest of eight children, Mr. Humphreys, after he graduated from high school taught school for some time before returning to the farm. Both have been active members of the United Church all their lives.

E. Mills Landmark

This district has seen quite a few changes in the past few years, some farms have been sold, new people have moved into the area, new modern homes have been built and a few of the old houses have come down. Recently the large, old residence on the south side of Brookside Road was torn down. It is with regret that we view the remains of this once lovely old home, which commanded such a view of the surrounding country and has witnessed many changes from those far off horse and buggy days.

This house was built in 1830 by Captain Boyd, a British officer who received the land from the Crown as a reward for military service. The basement of the house was made of stones, mud plastered and the sills were 18" square logs. The house was built of wood cut on the property - 12" square pine logs stood on end. These were mortised into the top and bottom plates with wooden pegs. The outside was of rough cast. Some of these timbers were still in place at the time of demolition and were in good condition. The square nails used in construction were blacksmith made. The house had seen considerable change through the years. The wide staircase which originally led to the three large rooms on the second floor had been removed and the upstairs rearranged to provide more bedrooms.

The house with its handsome front door with its two glass panels and old fashioned lock and key, faced Yonge Street and overlooked a small pond. It was reached by a tree lined lane, located a few hundred yards south of where the White Rose station now stands.

Mr. Wilmott purchased the farm from Captain Boyd and in 1882 Ezra Clubine bought the farm and he and his family lived there until 1911. His son, Wellington, took over the farm in 1887 shortly after his marriage and most of his family were born there.

In 1911 the property was sold to a development company and from then on the house deteriorated.

It is interesting to note that some of Captain Boyd's neighbours included the Bernards, the Kinnears and the Hamiltons, none of whom appear to have any descendants here now.
