Howes took a second in the mid-summer championship's 35-lap feature and tied as the night's top point man with Port Credit's Barry Wilson. Wilson, incidentally, had scored only 12 points in the four preceding weeks. An accident to Kel Mashinter of Toronto proved to be a break for Howes. Just as Mashinter was rolling over into the infield on the second lap, Howes' car threw its right rear wheel. The delay caused by Mashinter's spill allowed Howes enough time to get repairs done. He led from the second lap to the 23rd before Jerry Watson took over, gaining an eight-length edge at the finish line.

The Cooksville brother team of Jerry and Bob Watson now leads the standing, 95-72. Saturday's win was Jerry's third and the fifth for the family in nine Saturday's racing. Jerry has won 11 races and his fourth-place finish in Saturday's race for the top 10 point men was his lowest rating in 20 starts. He started in the last row among 22 feature drivers Saturday and was forced to do most of his passing on the corners.

Port Credit's Diane Rosevear won her second ladies' feature in a row. She leads Jo Cresswell of Willowdale 30-23.

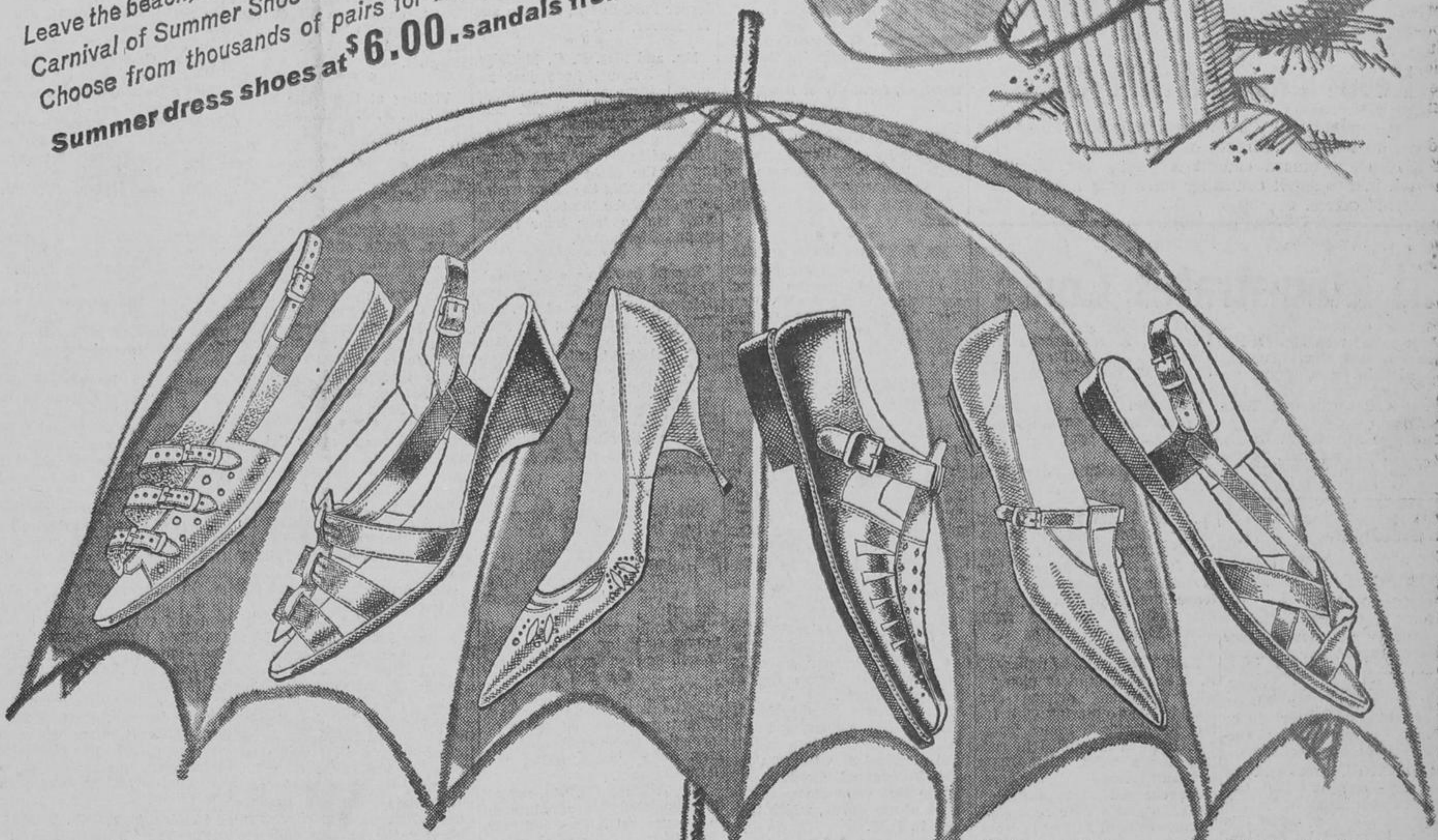
## Veterans Hitting Well
