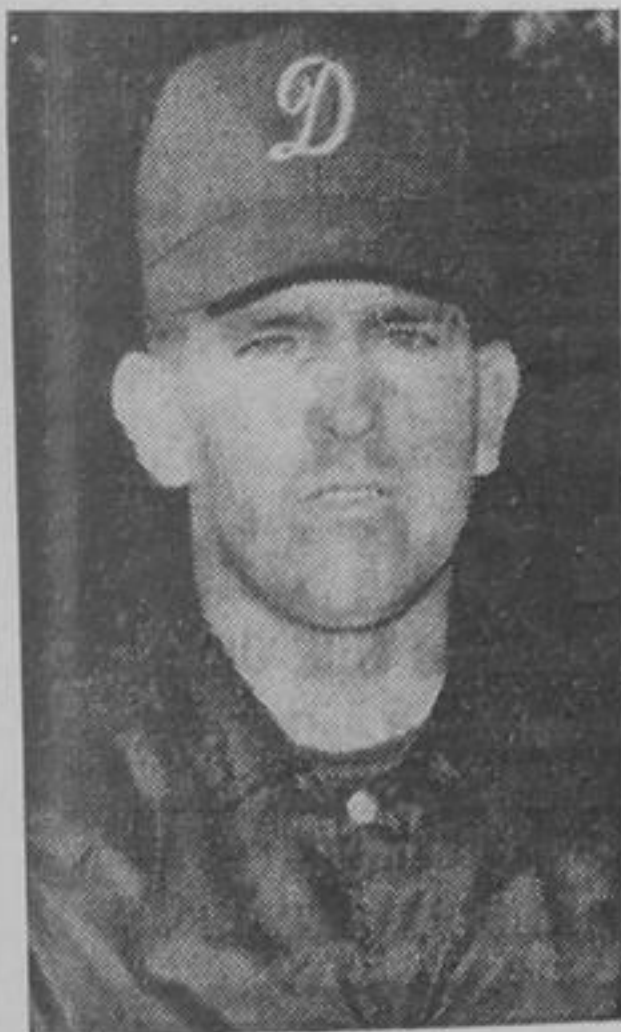


## Only 28 Batters Face Judd

## Announce New Sports Plan For R. Hill High

Mr. Bill Babeock, physical education director for Richmond Hill High School, has announced a new experimental sports plan. He hopes to induce more student participation in a school sports program while de-emphasizing the inter school aspects of secondary school sport.

Under the plan Richmond Hill will have not one but four junior football teams. These teams will operate on an intramural basis and will play a regular schedule in an intramural league. Exhibition games may be arranged with other schools.

This should provide football for far more players than has been possible heretofore. It should also provide an opportunity for senior students to demonstrate and develop leadership qualities as they will coach teams, arrange scheduling and officiate at games.

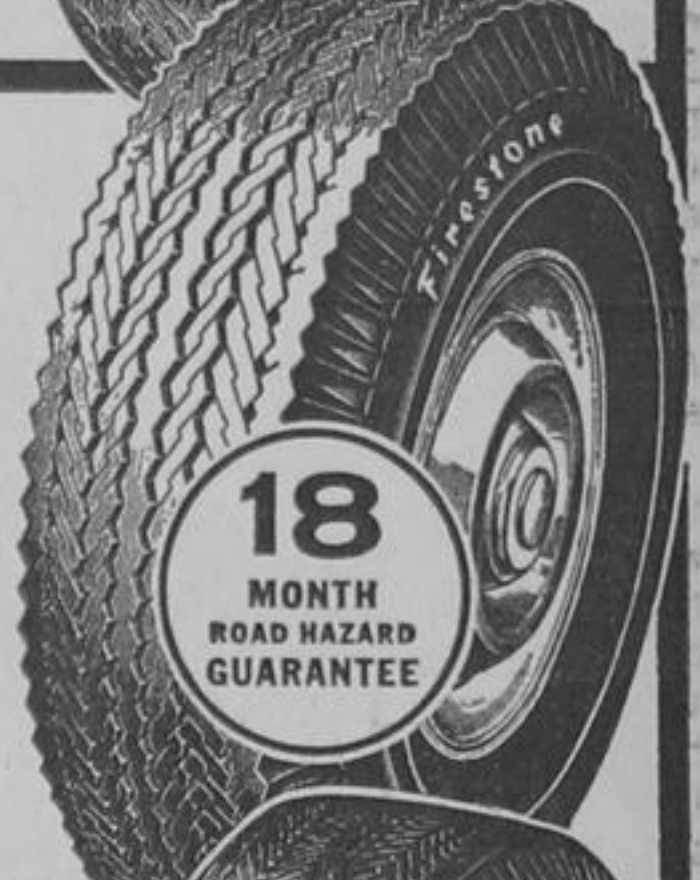

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This amendment constitutes a new Official Plan which replaces the present Plan which has been in effect since 1956. The new Plan was prepared in 1962 and explained at public meetings in the spring and summer of that year. It has since been referred to the Ontario Municipal Board for a hearing.

The new Plan provides for the overall development of the Municipality for a period of approximately the next 20 years and deals with land use, community development, road development and timing of urban development.
