"We have also agreed to as early a start as possible," the reeve said.

"This is a heavily populated area as well as a by-pass for Highway 11. The maintenance cost of the section for the Department of Highways is very high," he said.

Mr. Perkins said the road was a mass of potholes following last week's heavy rains. "It is just a waste of money trying to grade and treat it."

He referred to a delegation which appeared before Richmond Hill Council a month ago when parish priest Father F. C. Robinson, Our Lady Queen of the World Church and a representative of Dan's Esso Station presented a 130name petition from merchants and residents which called the road "a menace to safe driving and a deterrent to future development, sales of homes in the adjacent subdivision and private businessmen" and requested immediate action on the proposed improvements.

Promise A Delegation

"We promised the delegation we would bring this to county council," Mr. Perkins said.

Richmond Hill Deputy - reeve Stanley Tinker said the special committee concurred with any future plans Toronto and York Roads Commission might have with the development of Bayview south of Markham Road.

Markham Reeve Wilfred Dean said he felt the road should receive consideration in next year's county budget. Earlier, Mr. Perkins had estimated the project would cost about \$200,000.


