

## TO THE ELECTORS OF YORK NORTH:

As this campaign draws to a close, most of you, I hope, will be casting your vote with some knowledge of what the issues are in this provincial election. Telling the voters what the issues are and what the candidate's qualifications are has been my job. Listening to what has been said and assessing the candidates is your job.

I have tried over the past few weeks to meet as many of you as possible although I am sure you will realize that with 70,000 voters and a riding of 1,500 square miles it is impossible to see all of you.

In my opinion the main issues are (1) education with the related problem of the heavy burden on the municipal taxpayer, and (2) crime and its extension into the Province of Ontario. I have tried to put forward some constructive ideas on education such as standardization of school designs at the provincial level, establishing salaries by the department of education instead of the annual competition among our 4,000 school boards for teachers, but one can barely scratch the surface of the subject in the short time left.

The recent article in Maclean's magazine, September 21st edition, and the recent resignation of Robert J. Cudney, Deputy Provincial Secretary (Globe & Mail, September 14, 1963) indicate in my judgment the most shocking indictment of a government too long in office and a party too arrogant and indifferent to the problem.

While I appreciate that there are other issues—pensions, medical care and others—these two are vital to our welfare.

I seek your support on election day fully realizing the tremendous responsibilities of representing what is in my judgment the most important riding in this province. With your help, I will try to give you an active voice in the affairs of the next Legislature.

In conclusion, may I personally thank you for your courtesy and patience shown me throughout the campaign.
