

> ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD NOTICE UNDER SECTION 30 OF THE PLANNING ACT

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Vaughan has applied to the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the provisions of Section 30 of The Planning Act for approval of its Restricted Area Bylaw 2857 passed on the 29th day of July, 1963, a full text of which is given hereunder, and a copy of the Explanatory Note.

Any person interested may, within 14 days after the date of this Notice, file with the Clerk of the Township of Vaughan notice of his objection to approval of the said Bylaw, together with a statement of the grounds of such objection.

The Ontario Municipal Board may approve of the said bylaw but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objections to the Bylaw will be considered.


