Ignorant Of Law

Fine For Killing

A recently-arrived Italian youth, Monday fined \$10 and costs for shooting six robins and a meadowlark pleaded his guilt and ignorance of the country's migratory birds laws.

Luigi Bizzotto of Woodbridge admitted through an interpreter, Joseph Parisi of Richmond Hill, that the birds found at a Woodbridge home had been shot near London.

Magistrate Russell Pearce said immigrants to Canada apparently are not told they shouldn't shoot migratory birds. He gave Bizzotto a Department of Lands and Forests booklet on hunting regulations and asked him to pass along the information to his friends.

Comments On Crothers

Secretary Outlined Plant's Position

With the proposed rezoning of the Crothers property at Highways 400 and 7 from M2 (open storage zoning) to M1 and the "For Sale" sign on the large property, it can be assumed the showcase plant of heavy equipment will not be built now.

The zoning was given to Crothers' to allow display of its machinery on the grounds rather than as storage in the case of a lumber yard. Planning administrator Tom Gillings said the zoning will be upgraded to prevent any other plant using the M2 designation for an undesirable, from the township's point of view, industry.

At this Monday's council meeting, both Reeve A. H. Rutherford and Deputy-reeve Jesse Bryson said Crothers is not a 'lost cause'.

They said if the plant had not been proposed for the area, local residents wouldn't have had the benefits of the water system currently being installed.

They said the plant's management has suffered temporary economic setbacks but didn't rule out the possibility of the plant eventually being built as proposed.

In September, 1962, Harry J. Keenan, secretary of George W. Crothers Limited in a "Letter to the Editor" outlined the company's comments on controversy over the Edgeley water supply or lack of it, and its position in relation to construction.

Outlining three reasons for the company's concern he said if the Edgeley well proposal was delayed, the plant construction would be delayed. He said the property didn't have a supply of its own.

The letter refuted local rumors that Crothers had made a "deal" with Vaughan Council for favoured treatment about water. Mr. Keenan said Crothers was looking for a site

near a main highway that would have the right services, that the company had plans for its own sewage disposal but looked carefully at water.

"We found Vaughan township had already established a well at Edgeley and were told the stage of development at that time was only part of the already established program for full development of the Edgeley supply," he wrote.

Mr. Keenan said the company asked in open council to approve its application for rezoning along with a resolution to install a watermain along about 3,000 foot frontage of the property. He said council agreed to recommend the main be installed as a local improvement, with the cost being assessed against the frontage, in other words that Crothers would pay for it.

He also said that Vaughan's proposed expenditure (at that time) of \$200,000 for the water development would probably bring back many millions in assessment.

Calling the proposed Crothers construction "the first bud in the springtime of Vaughan's development," Mr. Keenan said the company looked on Vaugh-

an as the next place where development of the Toronto area will spring up.
