Correct Road Hazard At Patterson School

Lowering and widening of Bathurst Street in preparation for paving has created conditions in front of Patterson School, which constituted a hazard to the children attending this school. Vaughan Township School Area Board were told by its property committee December 12.

The committee reported that representation had been made to the township road committee which had agreed to reduce the slope of the driveway. A 60-foot culvert will be installed to permit vehicles to pull onto the road shoulder while discharging and loading pupils.

Prov. Grant On \$185,902

\$278,000 Debenture Necessary For New 10-Room Maple School

Final approval for legislative grant purpose for the building of the new school at Maple was received December 6, Vaughan Township School Area Board learned Thursday evening of last week. A copy of this approval was forwarded immediately to Vaughan Township Council and through them to the Ontario Municipal Board for final approval of the issuance of the necessary debentures.

The new school will include eight classrooms, a kindergarten a general purpose room, and a small room for a library, and will be located near the shopping centre in the western portion of the village.

The amount approved is 10 rooms at \$20,000 per room less \$13,098 representing the present value of two rooms in the George Bailey annex, which are being reserved by the board for other than classroom use. This deduction is in accordance with the Department of Education's scale for depreciation. The net amount on which the province will pay a grant is \$185,902.

On the recommendation of the architect, the board's property committee decided to extend the south-west classroom wing to provide a small room for library purposes and secured a separate tender price on this item. A separate tender price for the additional cost of installing thermo-break windows throughout the building, and a separate tender price for the installation of a public address system were also called for. The library and the thermo-break windows will be included in the new school but the public address system will not.

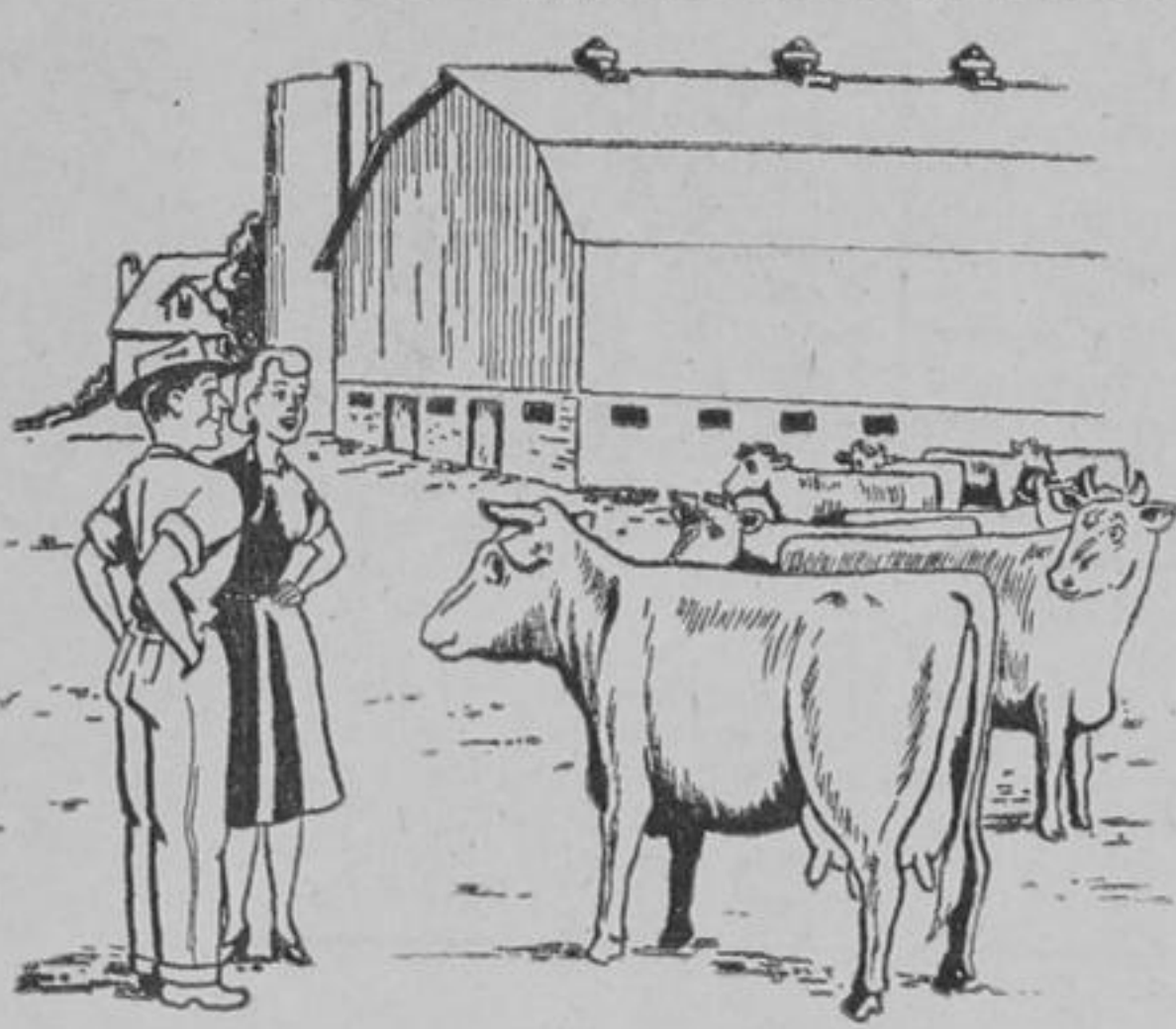
