Cancel O.A.C. Short Courses At Christmas

York County's Agricultural representative A. A. Wall has announced that the Christmas short courses at O.A.C. have been discontinued.

There will be no courses offered this year in the Christmas holiday. In their place, a special Farmers' Week at O.A.C. has been set up. This will be held from February 24 to 28.

There will be a different topic each day with corn, soils and forage, dairy cattle, swine and beef cattle each having a full day for lectures and discussion.

The agricultural representative also recommends this time of year for working on farm records. A change in the system used is most easily made at the start of a new year, he claims. The old "scribble" system is fairly common but he argues that accounts are a lot more useful if they are set up in a regular account book.

As usual, account books, free of charge, for farmers are available at the agricultural offices in Newmarket. One will be mailed on request.
