Drag Strip Left For '64 Council To Make Decision

Markham Township may still not get the controversial dragstrip, as a result of a stalemate at the last meeting of Markham Township for 1963 held at 9 a.m. Friday morning of last week.

When it came time for the third reading, no motion was presented to council, which meant the bylaw will be held over to be dealt with at the first meeting of the 1964 council.

At a meeting of council on December 16 Councillor Charles Hoover claimed that council should not enter into any contract or obligation following the election of a new council unless it has been approved by the municipal board.

Mr. Hoover claimed that such was not the case because the council comprised only four members due to the death of Reeve Wilfred Dean, and with the defeat of Deputy-revee Allan Sumner the new council would only include three of the five former members.

Reeve Charles Hooper disagreed saying there were only four sitting members at the time of the election and with only Deputy-revee Sumner missing this would make up the three-quarter requirement. Deputy-revee Alan Sumner agreed.

Clerk Harry Crisp reported that such action on the part of council was contrary to sound legal procedure. This opinion had been received by telephone and a confirming letter was in the mail but had not been received by the time the meeting was held. He reported the solicitor as saying that exemption of one property could be challenged.
