In an earlier game the Willowdale Rangers showed Newmarket Cubs how it's done as they handed a 5-2 defeat to

them to retain their first place position over Leaside Larks who trail by two points.

It was Gary Stamp and Ron Browne all the way for Thornhill as they launched three bombs apiece at the porous Downsview defence. Stamp also came up with three assists to go with his three goals and moved into second spot in the individual scoring race with 22 points

on 17 goals and five assists. For Downsview it was a tale often told this season: Enough offence but less than nil defence. The losers jumped into an early 3-0 lead on first period goals by Chester Boucher and a single by Jack Gilbert before their wobbles set in.
