Through books you can enrich your spirit with the Psalms, the Beatitudes, the thirteenth chapter of First Corinthians and all the other fine writings touched with divine fire.  
 Through books you can know the majesty of great poetry, the wisdom of philosophers and the findings of scientists. Through books you can find where the great thinkers of yesterday left off, because books have immortalized man's knowledge. Through books you can orient your life to the world you live in, for books link the past, the present and the future. There is a vast storehouse at your command. One way to get in a variety of reading is to read several books at a time, turning from one to another as your mood changes... a biography, a novel, a volume of history, a book about your business. Read something each day. With only 15 minutes a day you can read twenty books a year.
