### Oak Ridges And King Girls Win Poster Contest

Names of 75 elementary and secondary school students in Ontario whose safety posters were chosen from among the 20,000 entries to the Department of Transport's poster contest were announced last week.

Among elementary school winners was Linda McGinty, 15, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Paul McGinty of 20 Wilcox Avenue, Oak Ridges. Linda was a grade 8 student at Our Lady of Grace Separate School last year. Because her poster was chosen, Linda's school will receive a cash award of \$25 to be used for the purchase of books or pictures.

Lucille Graham of King City also won a \$25 award for the same school with her poster.

The picture project was sponsored during the spring term for primary and secondary school children. A panel of experts on children's art selected 25 of the secondary school entries and 50 of the elementary school entries. Many will be used in Department of Transport safety exhibits.

Transport Minister Irwin Haskett said the response to the safety poster project was "far beyond expectations, both in quantity of entries and in the quality and skill and the imagination shown by the artists."

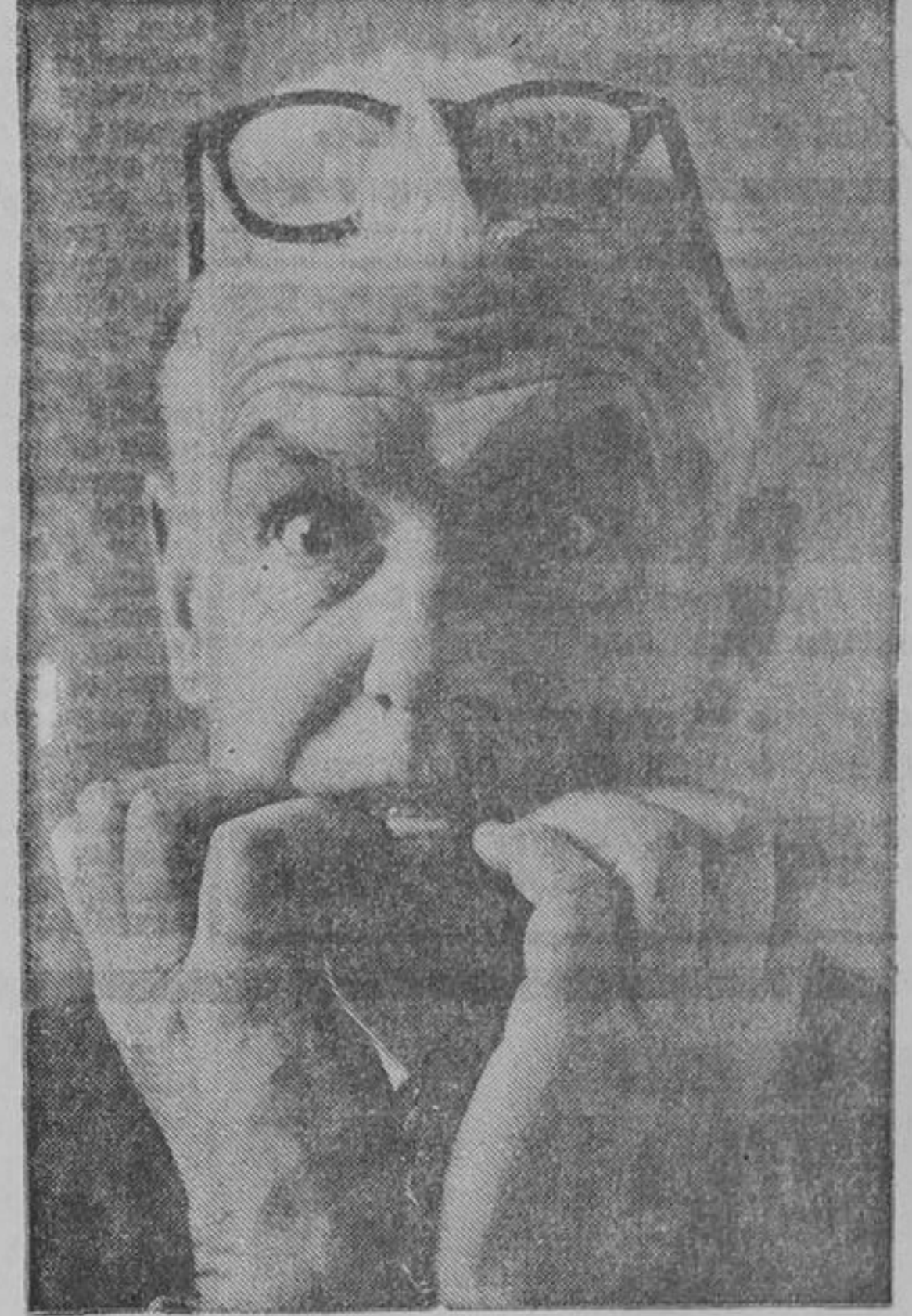
