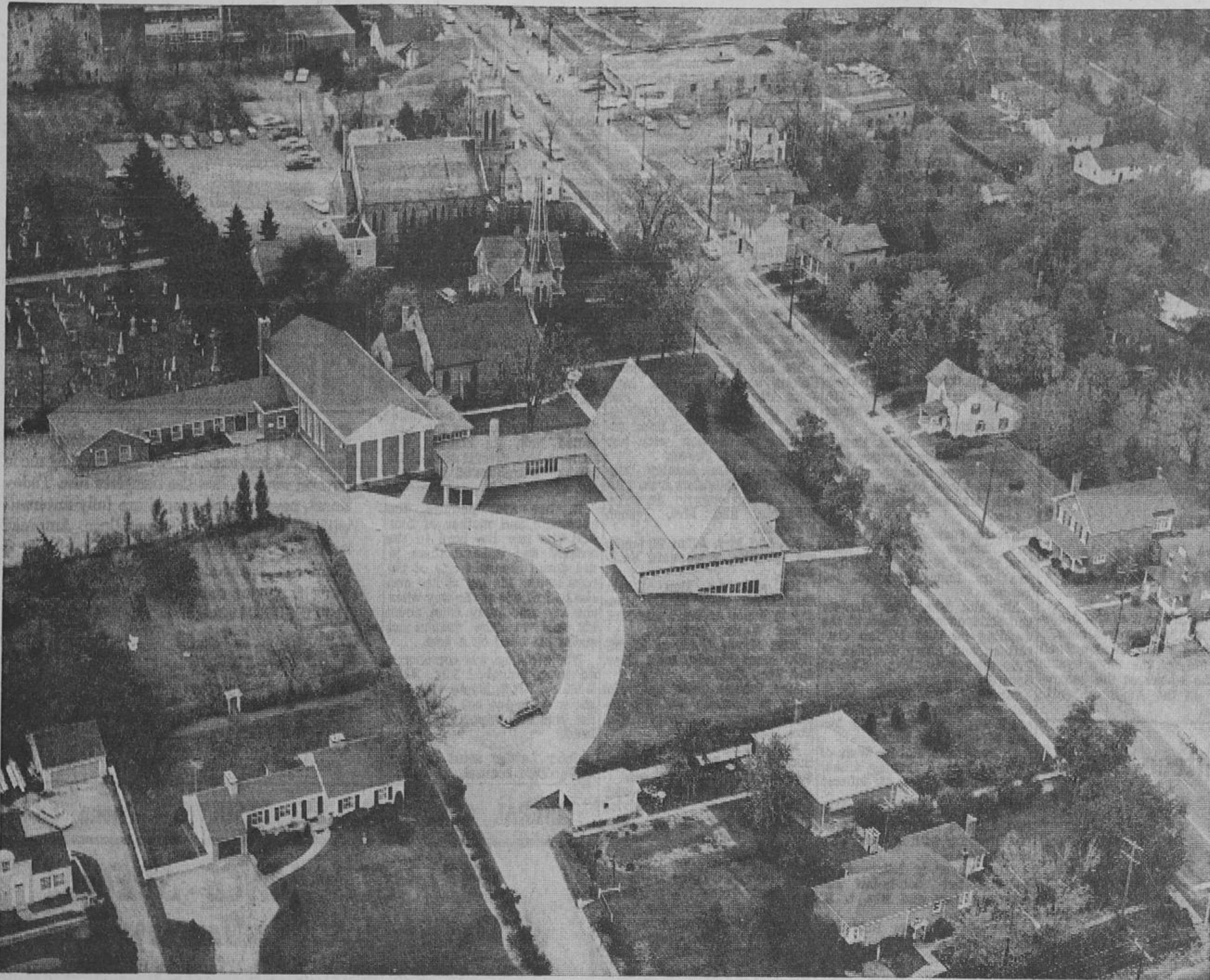


Bishop Wilkinson And Lieutenant Governor Earl Rowe Will Dedicate New St. Mary's

Legion Jr. Auxiliary Youth Program

A new and interesting program for youths in Richmond Hill and district between the ages of 14 and 20 is being offered in a junior auxiliary to the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 375. In fact this is the first time such a program has been offered in this province according to Legion President Frank Barrott.

The program for the new auxiliary will feature instruction in citizenship, hunting and fishing, wrestling, unarmed combat, including judo, sports of all kinds, safe driving, precision drill team, pipe band and other associated activities. Also included will be many varied social activities to be planned and organized by the young men themselves. They will also be invited to join all Legion parades where possible.

All youths in the district will be accepted for membership, whether their fathers are veterans or not. Initiation fee is a nominal \$1 and annual fees will be \$3. A committee of five senior Legion members will oversee operation of the auxiliary as an advisory board. They are Frank Barrott, Rick Pillage, William Luckin, Ernest Benton and Charles Hawkes.

By-laws are being drawn up and will be presented to the Legion provincial command for approval. These provide for a set-up practically the same as that of the senior Legion, with a president, three vice-presidents, secretary, treasurer, sergeant-at-arms and an executive body. Members will be sworn in at a ceremony similar to that used by the sponsoring organization.

Richvale Auto Firm Expansion Refused

A request for rezoning land for Richvale Auto Service from R3 to CW (highway commercial) was refused by Vaughan Planning Board and its reasons are to be sent to Vaughan Council.

The board, in a report to council Monday night, said Richvale Auto Service, a large auto compound fronting Yonge Street and surrounded by homes and motels, had asked to rezone its property to allow expansion of the premises.

At a public hearing, local residents complained of bright lights and long hours and inconvenience of the existing project but the company's solicitor was granted an extension to discuss the matter with the people concerned.

According to the board, this had not been done "nor was extension of the development in the best interests of the township."

Youth Sentenced To 30 Day Term In Church Fight

A Stouffville area youth Tuesday was sentenced to 30 days in jail for assaulting another youth at a Mennonite Church meeting in September.

John Staken, who came to Canada from the United States several years ago and was under the wing of several area Mennonite families while here, had changed jobs quite a few times, according to a pre-sentence report received by Magistrate O. S. Hollinrake.

The magistrate noted that Staken's action "of knocking out a man's teeth at a religious meeting shows you get out of control."

He said he wasn't in a position to deport the youth but felt a jail term should make an impression.
