GUEST SPEAKER

He said he felt there was a great deal of hope in the present generation and that young people nowadays have much more confidence than the older generation had. "You are going to make history," he told the graduates, "whether you like it or not. The only question you are going to be asked to answer is what kind of history."

Mary Farwell was presented with the Chancellor Strath Scholarship of Trinity College, University of Toronto, and the second student association prize in grade 13. Mary had 85.1% in the departmental examinations.
