Richmond Hill Youths Admit \$1,100 Break-in

Five Richmond Hill youths Tuesday admitted stealing about \$1,100 worth of goods from a Gormley estate last weekend.

John Wayne Mullin, 16, Wayne Toole, 17, Marcel LeBlanc, 20, Barry Lee Dyson, 20, and Eric Satterwaite 25, all pleaded guilty to break, enter and theft from the home of prominent businessman R. C. Birkenshaw, RR 2, Gormley.

Mullin, Toole, LeBlanc and Dyson are also charged with stealing a car belonging to Frank Resentera of 9675 Yonge Street after it was parked in a Richmond Hill hotel parking lot November 13.

On the break-in charge, they were remanded for pre-sentence

Blames Teen Driving Fined \$200, Costs

A Stouffville man who said in his defence he was fed up with the way teenagers drove their cars was fined \$200 and costs for impaired driving.

Thomas Richard Montgomery, R.R. 2, Stouffville, represented in Richmond Hill Magistrate's Court Tuesday by Paul Mingay, pleaded not guilty to the charge laid by Markham Police September 22.

Key witness was Toronto watch salesman David Stokes, 20, who said Montgomery's car sideswiped him at Highway 401 and Highway 48 and alternately speeded ahead of him and behind him all the way north to Markham Village.

Stokes claimed Montgomery tailgated his car, locked bumpers at one point and pushed his car up to speeds of 70 and 80 mph. When the two finally stopped, he said Montgomery was staggering, smelled of alcohol and took several wild swings at him until police arrived.

Village Sgt. William Vance said Montgomery smelled of alcohol and admitted he had "had one too many and shouldn't be driving."

Fluoridation Group Formed In Favor

"There will be no increase in either taxes or the cost of utilities if fluoridation takes place," he told "The Liberal" Tuesday.

Sodium silicofluoride is recommended by the Ontario Water Resources Commission as the most economical and widely used of the fluorides.

The town, if given the okay by voters on the December 5 ballot will use about three tons of fluoride a year at a cost of \$618. Maintenance costs will be about \$2,000 a year.

Since it is impossible for the average voter to study all reports and information on the subject, he said, they must rely on the integrity of scientists who have done so and without exception these men recommend addition of fluoride to drinking water.

Cost of fluoridating Richmond Hill's water supply will be about 25 cents a person in the first year, according to figures released by Works Commissioner Otto Whalen.

This will be halved in subsequent years once fluoridating equipment is installed and present equipment converted.

Reeve James Haggart in releasing Mr. Whalen's figures said the increased costs will be absorbed in revenue from other utilities.

Richmond Hill To Appoint Four New Retarded Children's Auth.

Recent Ontario legislation, whereby the province assumes the major portion of the cost of educating retarded children, will mean that effective January 1, 1965, a retarded children's authority must be set up for the area being served by Thornhaven School, D. A. Brown of Markham Village informed Richmond Hill Council Monday evening.

Bill 131 provides for a six-man authority to be appointed for the purpose of operating the school for retarded children. Two members are to be appointed by the local association for retarded children, Mr. Brown noted, reporting that these appointments have been made and are: D. A. Brown, Markham Village and T. Jennings, Richmond Hill.

An informal "bull session" attended by representatives of King, Whitchurch, Vaughan and Markham Townships and the Villages of Stouffville, and Markham, which all have children attending the school has been held he reported.

Milliken Lad Caught Damage Tombstones

A 17-year-old Milliken boy was convicted of damaging tombstones in a pre-Halloween prank October 28 at Hagerman Hill Cemetery, south of Unionville.

Michael Harry Campbell pleaded guilty to the Markham Township Police charge when he appeared Tuesday in Richmond Hill Magistrate's Court.

Markham Const. John McCaig said Campbell with five other boys, all juveniles, used the cemetery as home base when they threw tomatoes at passing motorists.

Sometime during the evening, at least 25 of the grave markers were pushed over and at least 10 damaged, he said. Restitution has been made of \$55.50, he said.

Magistrate Russell Pearce said Campbell showed wanton disregard for the quiet dignity of a graveyard and remanded him on \$500 bail to Newmarket Court awaiting pre-sentence report.

Dr. A. W. R. Doan

Funeral services were held Monday for Dr. Arthur Wallace Ross Doan, former Toronto school inspector and former treasurer of Township School Area No. 1 Markham and Vaughan, who died Friday at his home on Upper Canada Drive, Willowdale.

Dr. Doan was born on a farm near Queensville and attended Queen's University and the University of Toronto. He was teacher and principal at several Toronto schools until his appointment as inspector in 1933. He retired in 1948 but in 1951 became treasurer for the school area. He held this post until 1957. Ross Doan Public School in Richvale is named for him.

He leaves a son, Dr. Kenneth Henry Doan of Winnipeg, a daughter, Mrs. Alex. B. Kaye of Willowdale, and a sister, Mrs. W. H. Eves of Queensville.
