African Priest At St. Mary's Ang. Sunday Morning

Rev. Yokana Mukasa from Mukono, Uganda, East Africa, who is doing post-graduate study at the University of Western Ontario, will be the guest preacher at St. Mary's Anglican Church next Sunday morning at 10:30. Mr. Mukasa has been headmaster of a boys' school and chaplain to the teacher training college in his own country. He expects to return to Uganda and teach theology at Bishop Tucker College in Mukono, from which he is on leave as deputy warden.

In the evening at St. Mary's there will be the traditional "Festival Service of Lessons and Carols", patterned after the famous annual service at King's College Chapel, Cambridge. The lessons will be read by members of the local Curtain Club and the music includes many well known carols and anthems presented by the choir of the church under the direction of Organist Mrs. Evan Cover and the Choir Leader Jack Large.

The choir will sing informally from the gallery from 6:30 until the service begins at 7 p.m.

New Board Meets Jan. 2 Newly Elected Trustees Observe At TSA1 Meet

Observers at the December 7 meeting of TSA 1, Markham were the two newly-elected trustees, E. W. Scott and T. M. Lynd. They will take over their duties as trustees for a two year period at the first meeting of the new board, scheduled for January 12.

Included in the report of the education committee, given by J. E. Sand in the absence of Trustee John MacKay, was a schedule for the showing of six films on the new mathematics being taught in the schools. The films were shown to teachers and interested parents at Unionville Public School on December 7 and 8 and at Woodland Public School on December 9 and 10. They covered such topics as the need for modern mathematics, sets, numbers and numerals, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division of whole numbers.

The board policy re size of schools was discussed and it was agreed that as neither very large nor very small schools provide the best educational opportunity for children and very small schools are not economically desirable, the board's policy would be to plan schools with a minimum of 10 regular classrooms and a maximum of 20. It was pointed out by Chairman Louise Aime that the policy was, at best, only a guide and that future boards may be faced with problems of which the present board is not aware which could cause some variation from this policy.
