Mrs. Catherine Peterman Is 100 Years Old

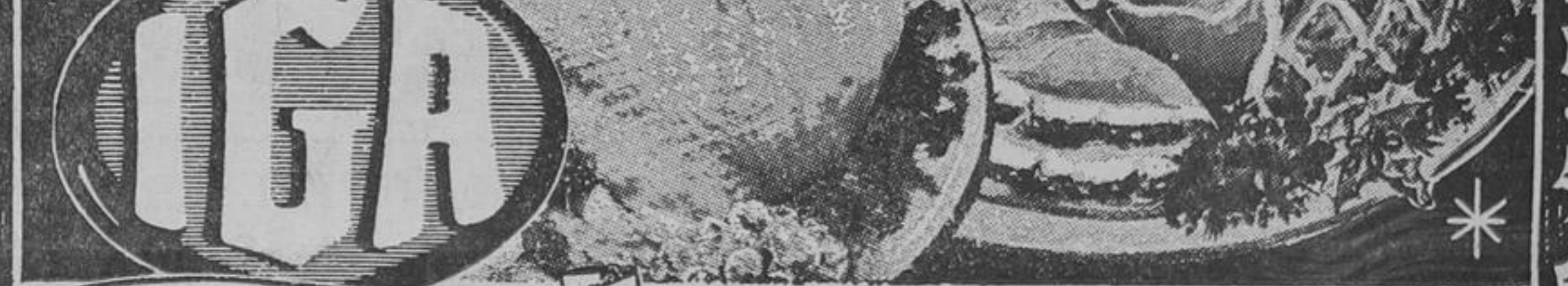
