Council Will Not Supply Fluoride For Children

Richmond Hill Council decided Monday night to acknowledge receipt of a letter from N. Roy Clifton, president of the Civil Rights League, Richmond Hill Branch, proposing that council provide free calcium fluoride pills to all families which include children of eight years of age or under.

The league is a group of citizens "who felt it their responsibility to oppose artificial fluoridation of the water supply" when the question was put to the electorate in December.

The letter stated, "We feel this proposal will place those who favored fluoridation of the water supply in the same position financially, as if the measure had passed, and yet will not infringe on the freedom of those who prefer not to use fluoride."

Councillor Lois Hancey asked that council defer action until the next council meeting to determine whether such assistance would be legal and how many children would be involved.

Mayor Thomas Broadhurst stated the electors had given a very definite and precise negative answer to the question in December, and felt council could not adduce reasons for opposition. "We don't provide medicine or drugs except for welfare recipients. We would be getting into realms beyond our powers," he continued.

Deputy-reeve Floyd Perkins felt that handing out the pills could be a full-time job. "The people have spoken and quite decisively," he said.

Councillor Eric Handbury felt the proposal was rather more political than made in the true spirit of goodwill. "If adopted by council it could prevent the question being brought up again," he noted.

Councillor Walter Scudis reported that before the vote much was heard of the dangers of fluoride. "Now these same people want to give this 'horrible stuff' to children under eight. I can't believe it's all right to give it to a portion of the population if it is not all right to give it to everyone."

Reeve Donald Plaxton felt it was really getting far away from the responsibility of council. "If we are going to provide pills for children under 8 we might well expect to be asked to provide medication for other age groups."
