

Council Praises Grant Seekers

Two representatives of the federation of agriculture managed to rid Markham Township Council of \$100 at an afternoon meeting last week, and were proudly commended for their efforts.

Elson Miles and Harold Lapp appeared before council and requested a grant of \$100 to be used toward prizes for the Farmstead Improvement Contest, which will be held in connection with the International Plowing Match in Markham Township next fall.

Mr. Lapp, who addressed council, said the contest would be divided into two classes, with the first one stressing large improvements and renovations on big buildings, and the second for general cleanup work.

"The amount of money spent (by the contestants) won't be taken into consideration by the judges," said Mr. Lapp.

He said the federation planned to contact all councils in the county, as well as various businesses, and request a grant of \$100.

"However, we won't restrict you to that," said Mr. Lapp.

Councillor Cleary Palmer described the project as a "worthy cause."

"You are to be highly commended," he said.

Council approved the grant unanimously.

Horace J. Savage Passes Suddenly

Death claimed Horace James Savage of 105 Baker Avenue, Richmond Hill, suddenly January 19 at Sunnybrook Hospital. Mr. Savage was stricken at his home early in the day and taken to the veterans' hospital where he died a few hours later.

Mr. Savage came to Canada in 1912 from England and enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery on August 7, 1914. He served three years and 21 days in France and Belgium and was discharged in 1918 with a heart ailment. He was married in Devon, England, in 1919 and returned to Canada with his wife in 1923.

Before coming to Richmond Hill Mr. Savage was with the Department of Transport, Windsor Airport, where he retired in 1957.

He was a member of Ontario Lodge 521 AF & AM, Windsor; Perfection Lodge A & ASR, Windsor; and the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 375, Richmond Hill.
