Mechanical Tax Billing Saves Time And Money

"Preparation and mailing of 5,500 tax bills, once an eight-week grind for municipal employees in Richmond Hill, can now be completed in two weeks and without the high cost of overtime," says an article in the January 1965 issue of "Civic Administration".

The article ascribes the increased efficiency to an accounting machine, the F1500 Typing Sensimatic, manufactured by Burroughs Business Machines Ltd.

Deputy-Clerk-Treasurer L. M. Clement is quoted as saying in introduction of the machine has cut the annual billing task down to size and produced these important fringe benefits:

- Four separate mill rates are locked into the accounting machine, saving the time of manual pre-calculation.
• Collections arrive earlier, allowing the town to save bank interest by paying off loans ahead of time.
• Instalments are calculated automatically by the machine.
• A complete breakdown can now be given on local improvements.

In 1962, the article recalls, when the town's population was 16,000, the eight-week tax billing job was a tedious time for employees and expensive for the town.

Previously, all rates had to be pre-calculated before tax bills could be processed. The town's four mill rates, now locked into the machine, are: residential public school; commercial and industrial public school; residential separate school; commercial and industrial separate school.
