Vaughan police also reported another accident in which a pedestrian was struck while walking along a thoroughfare. The accident occurred on Crestwood Road, near Steeles Avenue, February 5, about 8 p.m.
In Branson Hospital, where she is being treated for injuries to her head and back is Mrs. Josephine Nosan, 32, of 100 Crestwood Road. She was injured when hit by a car driven

by Girvan W. Ross, 21, of 127 Garden Avenue, Richmond Hill. Both were proceeding west at the time.
Mrs. Nosan's son, John, 2½, who she was carrying when the accident occurred, was slightly shaken up, but was released from hospital after treatment.

One person was injured and more than \$800 damage was done to two cars in an accident at Bathurst Street and Highway 7, about 8.50 a.m., February 8.

"Diary Of A Scoundrel" Has Outstanding Cast

It all began with the diary—an expose of Moscovites—vintage 1860, by a scoundrel whose greatest fault is ambition—whose greatest sin honesty. Allan Stewart plays the lead role in the Curtain Club's production, "The Diary of a Scoundrel" commencing February 10 at the theatre, 25 Yonge St. N. To this suave role of Gloum-ov, Mr. Stewart brings his wide experience gained on radio and T.V. which delighted everyone in his first Curtain Club role as the captivating Mr. Harcourt in "The Country Wife".
His "dear frail old" mother, a conniving female, is played by Esther Postlethwaite who is very familiar to Curtain Club audiences once as a geisha in Teahouse of the August Moon and more recently as a beautiful "Lady of Quality" in "The Country Wife".
Anita Steiner is hard put to conceal her feminine charms, so often appreciated in the Curtain Club roles, clothed in ludicrous orange and green creations as the femme fatale Kleopatra.
Neville Cross, the dirty dushman of "Pygmalion" is now Mamaev—a compulsive eater and the cousin of the scoundrel. The diary rates him as "a poor old hippopotamus", but he is invaluable to the Curtain Club.
Joan Harold, the lovely Eliza of Pygmalion, is more than a little ga ga on religion as the beautiful Sofia Tourousina.
You wouldn't recognize the dashing hero of last season's "Ten Little Indians," Derek Miller, as the doddering old General Kroutitzky who as the diary says "manages to reach the age of 70 and still preserve intact the brain of a 6 year old child."
The sometime designer and artistic-about-town, Bill Denison, is in the role of a black-mailer in "The Diary of a Scoundrel"—a far cry from the

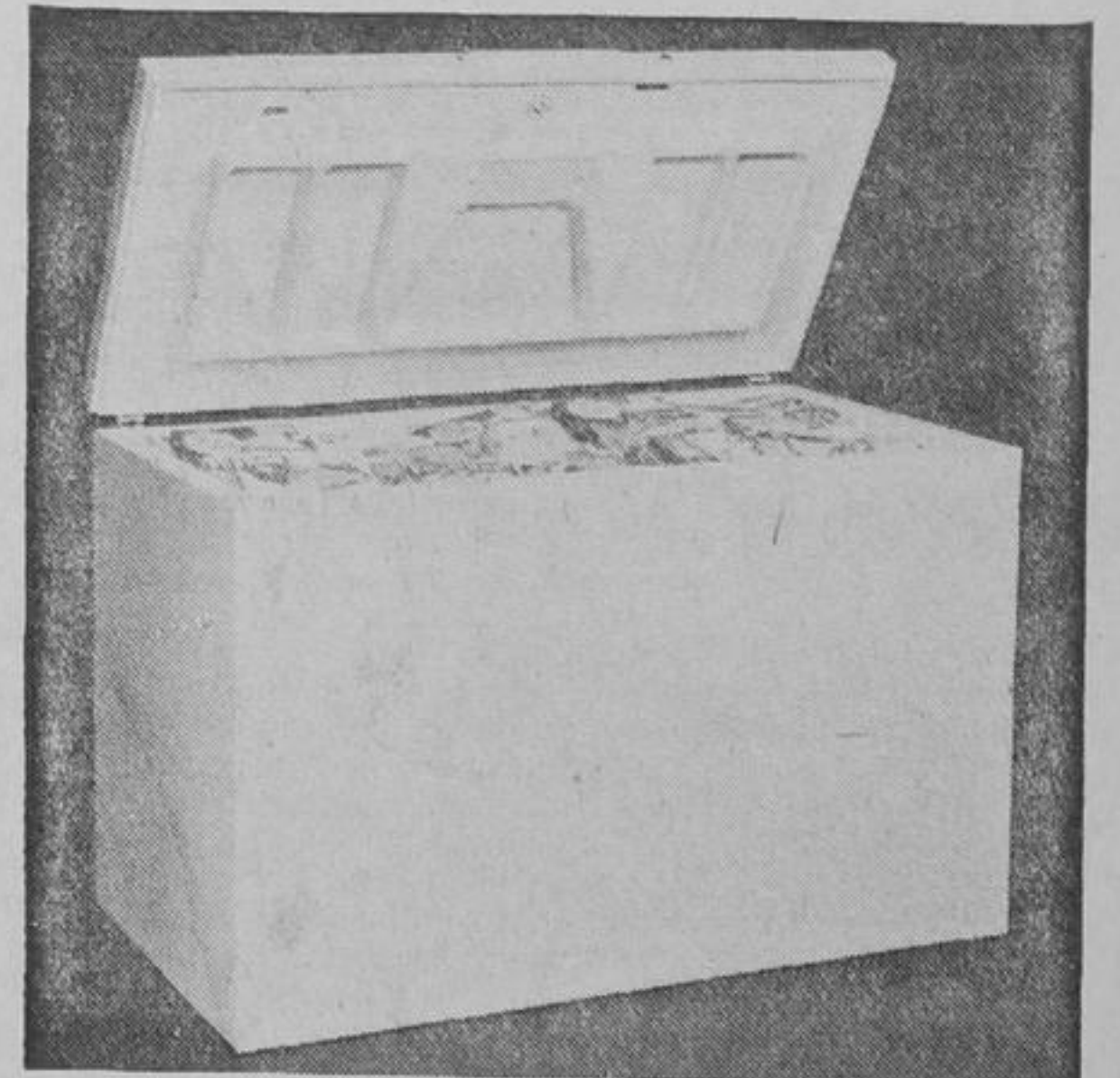
C.A. Firm Moves To Richmond Hill

Twp. Will Demand Cash For Plowing Private Laneways

Vaughan Township Council at its February 8 meeting adopted a new policy with regard to snow and ice removal on private property.
It was reported that the road department receives many requests during the winter to plow snow from farm lanes, etc. and that often it has been difficult to collect the cost of this work. Further, some people become annoyed when the work cannot be done immediately.
Requests are often received for the use of the township's steam generating equipment to thaw out frozen sump outlets at a time when it would damage the equipment by freezing of water lines, etc. if it were used, the road committee also reported.
To avoid difficulties and hard feelings over these matters, council decided that no private driveways, lanes or parking lots are to be plowed, except in case of an emergency, until all the roads in the township have been cleared. Further, such work will only be done on a cash basis with the plow operator to collect payment for the work and issue a receipt.
It was also agreed that the township would not accept any responsibility for thawing frozen sump outlets.
