Hill Youth Sent To Trial Before Judge For Theft

A Richmond Hill youth was committed to trial before a judge and jury on a charge of car theft at a preliminary hearing in magistrate's court, Thursday of last week.

Committed was Thomas Bain, 18, of 447 Palmer Avenue, who earlier in the day was convicted, along with his brother, Albert Bain, 16, of a charge of assault occasioning bodily harm.

Testifying at the preliminary Constable Bruce Findlay, Markham Township Police, said that he had chased a stolen car at speeds up to 100 miles an hour, the evening of January 15. The car finally pulled into a private driveway and a man and a woman got out and ran off.

However, Constable Findlay said he apprehended the woman Diana Bain who turned out to be the wife of the accused, almost immediately.

Constable Edward McBrien, Richmond Hill said that Bain had called him the next day, and had admitted driving the car, but said he had obtained it from a friend.

John Anderson, 292 Finch Avenue, Willowdale, owner of the car in question, said he had not given anyone permission to drive his vehicle. He said it had been stolen after he had left it in the driveway of his house with the motor running.

In committing the accused, Magistrate James Butler said it wasn't up to him to decide on the question of innocence or guilt, but whether he felt there was enough evidence to warrant a trial.

In the assault trial, John McPhee, 17, of Box 382, Richmond Hill, testified that Bain had hit him in the face in a restaurant, January 2.

He said Bain had come into the cafe with his brother, Albert, and had ascertained who had struck his brother in a previous fight. When McPhee said he had, the accused hit him, he said.

Albert Bain then kicked him in the face, the witness testified.

Defence counsel John Lawlor asked for a lenient sentence for Albert Bain, after his brother Thomas, had been given five days for the offence.

Mr. Lawlor said the accused had been drinking the night of the occurrence which probably had been the contributing factor in his actions.

In fining him \$50, Magistrate Butler told the accused it had only been his counsel's plea that had saved him from a jail term.
